Dr. Edgar N. Jackson, a world renowned crisis Psychologist and Theologian, will present a series of special lectures at Coastal Carolina College on Tuesday, October 17. The topic and schedule of the lectures is as follows: "Dealing with Death and Dying" - 8:00 a.m.; "Coping with Personal Crises" -9:30 a.m.; "The Relationship of Reality and Consciousness" - 11:00 a.m.; "New Research in Holistic Health" - 2:00 p.m.

Dr. Jackson has lectured widely in universities, medical and nursing schools, seminaries and professional conderences in the U.S., Canada and more than a dozen foreign countries. He has authored more than twenty books and made contributions to fifteen others. He has published more than 300 articles in religious, secular and professional journals. Presently Dr. Jackson is a consultant for the medical publisher, Jason Aronson in New York. Dr. Jackson has had nine years of clinical experience and served as head of the New Rochelle Guidance Center, a state Liscensed Psychiatric clinic for children and their parents.

The lecture series is being presented under the auspices of the Divison of Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences and Nursing. A student organization, The Baptist Student Union is also supporting the lectures. All lectures will be presented in the Student Union Lecture Hall. The public is invited to attend and there will be no admission charge.
