Coastal students enrolled in Anthropology 101 recently made a field trip to Fort Watson Indian Mound near Santee, S.C., reports Dr. Reinhold Engelmayer.

"This mound is one of the largest Indian ceremonial temple mounds of the Mississippian Period," he says. "It was also used in the American Revolution by the British as a fort and was captured during the war by Francis Marion and his troops."

WISEMAN ATTENDS NATIONAL CONFERENCE

Dr. Dennis Wiseman, Associate Professor of Education at Coastal, recently returned from the Ethnic Heritage Studies Clearinghouse national field agent conference in Cleveland.
