COASTAL OFFERS ARTS SERIES

In preparation for next year's opening of Wheelwright Performing Arts Center, Coastal is sponsoring a cultural arts series featuring public performances by five nationally recognized entertainment groups. Presented by the Faculty Cultural Arts Committee at Coastal, the series includes performances by Tequila Mockingbird Chamber Ensemble (Sept. 20), the Alabama Shakespeare Festival (Nov. 15), the Preservation Jazz Company (Feb. 21) and the Pauline Koner Dance Consort (Mar. 18).

The series is subsidized by the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the SC Arts Commission and the College. Season tickets are \$9 each (\$1.80 per performance) and faculty, staff and administrators may buy season tickets for \$4 each (with a limit of two). See Al Poston for details.

CONTINUING EDUCATION NON-CREDIT

Faculty and staff may register for non-credit courses by calling the Office of Continuing Education, (EXT. 257) prior to September 4. There is no charge to faculty and staff for these classes. Coastal students may register for the non-credit classes for one-half the regular cost.

AEROBICS TROPHYS TO BE AWARDED

Coastal Aerobic instructor Carl King says four awards will be given annually to persons excelling in aerobics fitness programs. Professor King says the awards will be presented in four categories: male student, female student, male faculty/staff member, female faculty/staff member. GENIUS? PICK UP YOUR CHECK

If you're a genius, you'll be interested in a newly chartered foundation reported in the August 13 issue of NEWSWEEK. In 1980, the magazine reports, the recently created John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation will begin awarding \$37.5 million annually to "geniuses." The foundation requires no wordy grant proposals. Instead, foundation "scouts" will "discover" needy geniuses. The foundation is directed by J. Roderick MacArthur. "We've needed something like this since the Renaissance," explains Roderick.
