COASTAL ENROLLMENT UP TO 1,884

Coastal Carolina College has recorded the largest enrollment in the institution's 25-year history, with 1,884 students registering for fall classes. Compared to last fall's enrollment of 1,759, current enrollment increased 7.3%, according to Admissions Director Marsh Myers.

"Again Coastal seems to be growing faster than the other four-year colleges in the University system," Myers says. "The credibility of this institution has been well established by now in the minds of students, high school counselors, teachers and parents. With our location and the quality faculty we attract, the students in our section of the state are taking a second look at what they have here and they're deciding to stay home. Why not? a quality education in a place like this is hard to find."

According to Myers, the official FTE figure for the fall semester is 1,670.7, which is an increase of 7.5% over last year. While the majority of Coastal students are from Horry County, 439 students come from other parts of the state; 139 come from outside the state and 31 come from foreign nations. Transfer students number 210.

Business Administration is the most popular major, followed by Education and Sociology, Myers says.
