COASTAL OFFERS VARIETY OF NON-CREDIT SUBJECTS

Where can you learn how to improve your bridge game? Where can you rehildren attend dance classes? Where can you learn how to conserve energy in your home or develop a fine hand at water color painting? The answer: at Coastal Carolina College-through the college's Continuing Education program. The program offers residents and faculty members an opportunity to learn specialized skills from experts in non-credit classes which meet on weekends, in the afternoon or during the evening.

"We have a real varity of subjects for people who want to acquire a new skill or perfect one they already possess," explains Director of Continuing Education Dr. Marshall Parker.

Parker says registration for the continuing education courses is scheduled for Thursday and Friday, October 25-26, 10:00 am-4:00 pm, although anyone may register for a course by calling the Office of Continuing Education before October 25. Parker says his office will provide information and a schedule of noncredit courses upon request.

GRAD STUDENTS CAN REGISTER EARLY AT USC-COASTAL

Graduate students at USC Coastal Carolina College can register early for the spring semester. The University of South Carolina, which administers the graduate program at Coastal, will use computer registration to help avoid student lines and to handle admission problems for the spring semester.

Early registration for the spring semester of graduate school at USC Coastal Carolina College continues through Nov. 1, from 3-5 PM at the Coastal campus. Graduate students can make appointments for early registration and course advisement by calling 448-1481 or 347-3161.

FALL II BEGINS

Students who were unable to enter USC-Coastal Carolina College when the regular fall semester began last month and students who are unable to attend daytime classes now have an opportunity to attend evening classes in a part time eight-week program which provides full time credit for coursework. The program allows students to attend two eight-week evening sessions each semester, taking two courses during each session. At semester's end, the students who successfully complete the courses receive full credit for four courses, although they only participated in two courses at a time. The program is offered in the evening at Myrtle Beach Air Force Base and at the Georgetown Education Center as well as the Coastal campus Oct. 29th-Dec. 20th.

Registration for the Fall II evening program will be held on Thursday and Friday, October 25 and 26, 10 AM-4 PM, at the Georgetown Education Center, at Myrtle Beach Air Force Base or at Coastal Carolina College. Courses offered in the program range from Business to Archaeology and a full schedule is available from the Office of Continuing Education.
