'COCKS AT COASTAL SCRIMMAGE FURMAN

Frank McGuire's USC Gamecocks will battle the Furman University Paladians in a pre-season scrimmage at USC-Coastal Carolina College this Saturday, November 10th at 3 PM.

The scrimmage has become an annual event at Coastal Carolina College and will be preceded by a pre-season game between the Coastal Carolina Fighting Chanticleers and High Point College. The Chanitcleers posted an 18-13 season record last year and with seven veterans returning Chanticleer Coach Russ Bergman hopes to be a challenging competitor in NAIA's District VI this year. The scrimmage between Coastal and High Point is scheduled for 1 PM.

The USC Gamecocks will attempt to bounce back from a mediocre 18-13 season last year to build an impressive record in Coach Hank McGuire's 16th and final year of coaching at USC. McGuire is reportedly due to end his 30-year coaching span to become a highly ranked public relations official for the University.

The scrimmages at Coastal this Saturday are hosted by Coastal's athletic department and the college's alumni association. The alumni will serve a chicken bog lunch beginning at 11:30 AM in Coastal's College Center.

Both basketball scrimmages will be played in Kimbel Gymnasium, inside Coastal's Williams-Brice Building. Both scrimmages are free.
