## PARATORE PIANISTS TO PERFORM ON NOVEMBER 15

Anthony and Joseph Paratore, the first American duo pianists to claim first prize in the Munich International Music Competition, will perform at the new Conway High School Auditorium at 8 PM, Thursday, November 15th, as part of the USC-Coastal Carolina College Cultural Arts Series.

The pianists debuted with Arthur's Fielder's Boston Pops and won enthusiastic reviews for their performance at Charleston's 1978 Spoleto Festival. "Their last encore," wrote the New York Times, "drove everybody crazy. What a show-stopper!" The Los Angeles Times described the Paratores' performance in Los Angeles as "virtually faultless marksmanship, finely honed mechanical vigor and gallons of youthful verve."

The Cultural Arts Series presented by Coastal Carolina College is subsidized by the National Endowment for the Arts, the Southern Arts Federation, the South Carolina Arts Commission and Coastal Carolina College. Tickets are \$3.00 at the door, although season tickets for the Paratores and two future performances may be purchased at the door or at the College for \$9. Students, educators and school staff may purchase season tickets for \$6 and Coastal Carolina's faculty, staff and students may buy them for \$4.

## COASTAL CAROLINA AND H-G TEC PLAN CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS PARTY FOR DECEMBER 15TH

A visit by the official White House Santa Claus will highlight the Second Annual Children's Christmas Party in Conway this year. The event will be sponsored jointly by Student Clubs and Organizations of USC-Coastal Carolina College and Horry-Georgetown TEC.

The schools are making a unified effort to bring the spirit of Christmas to approximately 2,000 disadvantaged children in the Waccamaw-Grandstrand area. The party is scheduled for 7 PM, Saturday December 15th in the gymnasium of the old Conway High School. Andy Sivak, the "Official" White House Santa Claus for the past 30 years will preside over the party as he did last year.

## COASTAL HOSTS STRESS CONFERENCE

Crisis Psychologist Dr. Edgar N. Jackson is the featured leader of a special three-day conference on coping with professional stress which is being co-sponsored by USC-Coastal Carolina College Tuesday - Thursday, November 13, 14 and 15.

Entitled "Coping with Professional Stress -An Exploration of Human Dimension in Healing," the conference is designed to identify professional and personal stresses and resources to cope with the stresses when they are identified. The conference will meet at Coastal Carolina College, at Grandstrand General Hospital and at Conway Hospital.

Dr. Jackson, the conference leader, is a pioneer in the study of personality crisis and management. A resident of Vermont, he is a psychologist and Methodist minister, who leads frequent conferences on stress and crisis at medical schools, seminaries and professional associations. He holds undergraduate and graduate degrees from Ohio Wesleyan University, Drew University, Yale University and the Institute of Human Relations and Postgraduate Center for Psychotherapy in New York. He is author of a comprehensive text on crisis psychology entitled *Coping With the Crisis in Your Life*. For nine years he performed clinical practice and served as head of the New Rochelle Guidance Center, a psychiatric clinic for children and their parents in New York.

A special public session, "You Can Help With Your Own Healing," is scheduled at 2 PM on Thursday, November 15th in the College Center at Coastal Carolina College. There is no admission charge.

## WISEMAN ADDRESSES MICHIGAN CONFERENCE

Coastal Professor Dennis Wiseman recently returned from Dearborn, Michigan where he made a presentation to the Annual Conference of the National Middle School Association. The presentation, "Developing Learning Contracts for Middle School Instruction: A Student Centered Approach," was delivered at the Hyatt Regency Dearborn. The conference was an international meeting of approximately 2,000 educators. Wiseman is an Associate Professor of Education at the School of Teacher Education.
