WISEMAN AND HUNT AUTHOR **EDUCATION ARTICLE**

Coastal Professors Dennis Wiseman and Gil Hunt have co-authored an article designed to assist educators in working with culturally different children. Entitled "A Five Step Model for Teaching and Working with Culturally Different Children," the study has been catologued by the Educational Resources Information Center (ERIC) Clearinghouse on Urban Education, which is affiliated with Columbia University's Institute for Urban and Minority Education. The article is available to educators in print or on micro-

According to the Wiseman-Hunt article, culturally different children have been portrayed as members of a low socioeconomic group who suffer from poor self images and poor learning ability. Wiseman and Hunt trace this characterization to differences between the children's home environment and their school environment. and offer solutions to dealing with culturally different children.

COLLEGE CENTER SPACE MUST BE RESERVED

Dr. Robert Squatriglia, Dean of Student Development at Coastal, says his division is anxious to assist faculty, students and administrators who need to use the College Center, but Squatriglia says reservations must be made with his staff.

"A College Dining Service Banquet Manual, developed by Dining Service Director Robert Greer, has been distributed to each administrative office on the campus, "says Squatriglia. "The manual is for general campus use and details menus, prices, and services for a broad range of activities.

"Also included in the manual are College Center reservations instructions and a sample of a reservation form. Space reservations are separate from dining arrangements, and all space arrangements are processed by the College Center Office (College Center 206, Ext. 206). Space in the building should be reserved not less than five (5) working days prior to the date of the planned event, if possible. Space is at a premium in the College Center and you are urged to submit your space requests as well in advance of events as possible.

"Service of alcohol on the campus in general and the College Center in particular is restricted by state law and University/College policies. Information on alcohol policies may be obtained from the Office of Student Activities, College Center 206, and/or the 1979-80 Coastal Community."

CHANTS OPEN 79-80 SEASON

Coastal Carolina's Fighting Chanticleers have officially begun the 1979-80 basketball season with hopes for capturing the district championship. Coastal Head Basketball Coach Russ Bergman admits the new squad has a lot of talent, but he also describes the competition this year as the toughest Coastal has ever faced.

"Newberry, Winthrop, Lander, Francis Marion, USC-Aiken and Coastal all have a good shot at the title, " he told the Sun News. "I look for these six teams to be in the top six at the end of the season they could finish in just about any order you can imagine. It's going to be a toss-up."

Coastal finished 18-13 last year with a young team and Bergman decribes this year's squad as stronger and quicker, "So are most of the other teams in the district," he cautions. "We'll have much better speed and more quickness this year and some of the newcomers are also expected to contribute quite a bit."

Coastal's next contest is a doubleheader at Francis Marion College on Friday and Saturday, Nov. 23-24. On Nov. 23, Coastal plays Atlantic Christian College at the Florence campus at 6:30 PM, followed by a game between FMC and Friendship College. On Saturday, Nov. 24, Coastal plays Friendship at 6:30, followed by FMC vs. Atlantic Christian.

USC AND COASTAL CHOIRS TO PERFORM

The USC-Coastal Carolina Concert Choir and the USC-Columbia Choir will present joint performances in Columbia and in Conway in December. On Sunday, December 9th the choirs will perform Zoltan Kodaly's Missa Brevis at the First Presbyterian Church in Columbia at 7 PM. On Tuesday, December 11th, the performance will be presented at the First Methodist Church in Conway at 8 PM. The combined chorus is over 100 voices strong and will also perform traditional Christmas music. The USC-Columbia Concert Choir is directed by Dr. Arpad Darazs and the USC-Coastal Carolina Choir is directed by Professor Carolyn Cox.
