BULLDOGS NIP CHANTS: CHANTS FLOG FRIENDSHIP

Russ Bergman's Chanticleers lost a close one, but smothered another opponent during the weekend. In a doubleheader at Francis Marion College Friday night the Atlantic Christian Bulldogs held off Coastal in the second half to defeat the Chanticleers 72-65. The loss was Coastal's second in three games, but the Chanticleers displayed tremendous power Saturday night, defeating Friendship College of Rock Hill 109 to 62 in another doubleheader at Francis Marion. Friendship edged Coastal in the Chanticleers' opening game, but the Chants more than evened the score by totally dominating Friendship in the rematch. The Chanticleers are now 2-2 for the season and play Pembroke State College in Pembroke, NC Thursday, November 29th at 7:45 PM.

The Concert Choir will perform traditional Christmas carols, followed by a special musical presentation, "Letters to Santa," by the Coastal Ensemble.

USC-COASTAL HOSTS WRITING INSTITUTE FOR TEACHERS

South Carolina teachers will get some tips on evaluating student writing at a special two-day workshop at USC-Coastal Carolina College Friday and Saturday, December 7th and 8th. Entitled "Evaluating Writing," the institute is sponsored by Coastal Carolina College and the Horry County Department of Education. The program is aimed at advising middle school teachers, high school teachers and college teachers on techniques for evaluating student writing and teaching composition.

Coastal Carolina Professor of Teacher Education Patsy Candal says the program can provide definite aid toward the objective evaluation of student composition. "Participants will be involved in workshop training sessions using samples of student writing," she explains. "Specific evaluation techniques will include holistic and primary trait scoring procedures. Time will be provided for questions addressing needs of special interest groups."

Dr. Charles Cooper is the institute leader. Recognized by the National Council of Teachers of English as an authority on the evaluation of writing, Dr. Cooper is co-author of text on the subject and has developed a writing test now used by the New York State Department of Education. He is a consultant to the National Assessment of Educational Progress and is a Professor of Literature at the University of California.

The program begins Friday, December 7th at 9 AM with registration on the second floor of Coastal's Academic Building. The cost of the institute is \$25, which includes lunch on Friday and Saturday.
