COASTAL MEETS "CHILLING" FEDERAL ENERGY GUIDELINES

In compliance with energy guidelines issued by the federal government, the College is required to turn OFF all heating, ventilating and air conditioning systems when a building is unoccupied for eight hours or more. Exceptions are made if this policy endangers a facility or its contents.

This regulation applied to Coastal's Administration Building, the Academic Building, the Fine Arts Building, the College Center, the Maintenance Building and temporary structures.

Heating systems will be turned off in the buildings on Friday afternoons unless notification is made to Phillip Massey at Ext. 124. The deadline for exception requests is noon on Fridays.

FURMAN OVERWHELMS CHANTS; LADY CHANTS IMMERSE BAPTISTS

The Furman Paladins scored a decisive 89-65 defeat over the injury hampered Chanticleers Wednesday night at Greenville Memorial Auditorium. The win left Furman with a 2-1 record, while the Chanticleers fell to a 3-5 record. Although outmanned by Furman, Coastal shot consistently, hitting 11 of 12 free throws in a final rally at game's end.

The Lady Chants, meanwhile, thoroughly dunked Baptist College of Charleston 79-53 in a home game Thursday night. A full court press and accurate shooting led Coach Steve Taylor's team to an impressive win, with Coastal's Joan Cribb chalking up 21 points and 14 rebounds. The Lady Chants are now 3-1 for the season.

Andy Sivak, the official White House Santa Claus for the past 30 years, will preside over the festivities.

COASTAL, USC—COLUMBIA CHOIRS PERFORM

The USC-Coastal Carolina College Concert Choir and the USC-Columbia Concert Choir will present a joint Christmas program at 8 PM, Tuesday, December 11th at the First Methodist Church in Conway.

The combined chorus will be over 100 voices strong and will perform the mass Missa Brevis by Zoltan Kodaly and a program of traditional Christmas carols. The USC-Columbia Concert Choir is directed by Dr. Arpad Darazs, a native of Hungary who also directs the Columbia Philharmonic Orchestra. Darazs has taken the University of South Carolina Concert Choir to top honors in musical competition throughout Europe and has earned an international reputation as a musical director.
