

CONTINUING EDUCATION COURSES FREE TO FACULTY AND STAFF

Twenty-six special non-credit courses will be taught at Coastal beginning January 21. Most of the courses are designed for people who just want to pick up a new skill or learn a new hobby. Most of the courses are taught in the evenings and college officials say there's something offered for almost everyone.

Among the non-credit courses offered in Coastal's spring semester are Beginning, Intermediate and Advanced Tennis: Beginning, Intermediate Bridge; a course on how to stop smoking; courses in oil painting, drawing and watercoloring; Nutrition and Weight Control; a how-to course in tracing family histories; Shorthand; Ballet; Women's Career; Umpiring Softball and Baseball; Coaching Baseball and Softball; Folk and Square Dancing; Preparation for SAT and NTE; Weight Training; Cold Water Survival, Coaching Tennis and a course which profiles the current presidental candidates. All courses are free to faculty and staff.
