COASTAL HOLDS CHILD ABUSE CONFERENCE

On Friday, February 1st, Coastal is hosting "A Dialogue on Child Abuse," which is a conference on child abuse and neglect in Coastal's three-county service area. The conference is designed to formulate an organization which will develop hotlines, supportive programs, services and facilities to combat child abuse in Horry, Georgetown and Williamsburg Counties. Among the conference speakers are State Superintendent of Education Dr. Charlie Williams, Representative Parker Evatt, Lexington County Sheriff James Metts and State Social Services Commissioner Virgil Conrad.

TEXTILE EXHIBIT IN COLLEGE CENTER

An invitational textile exhibit of work by members of the San Francisco Batik Artists, Ann Marie Patterson of Seattle, Wash., and Marilyn Harrison of Boca Raton, Fla. will be exhibited at Coastal through February 8. The exhibit, held in the College Center, includes both wall hangings and clothing designed and dyed by the batik process of resist-dyeing. The display gallery is open Monday through Friday when the reception/information desk is staffed.

The library will also have an exhibit of traditional Indonesian textiles until February 5. Batiks and ikats, dyed woven fabrics from Bali, are on loan from the collection of Marianna Hamilton of Coastal's Art Department.
