NO WATS LINE AT COASTAL

A popular misconception that Coastal has a telephone WATS line has led to expensive telephone bills, according to Coastal's Business Office. "USC-Coastal Carolina College does not have a WATS (Wide-Area-Telephone-System)," say officials of USC's Telephone Services in Columbia. "Coastal has a 777 line which allows the college to make free calls to the University in Columbia or to the Columbia city area,"the officials explain, "but all other long-distance calls cost 22 cents a minute in-state and 27 cents a minute out-of-state. That's a reduced rate, but it still means every long distance call is deducted from Coastal's budget, except for calls to USC-Columbia or to the city of Columbia. The Columbia calls are free only if they are made on the 777 line."

Coastal's Business Office urges telephone users to remember the cost when calling long-distance.

MBAFB CREDIT UNION VOTES AGAINST 4 1/4%

The Board of Directors of the MBAFB Credit Union voted on January 21st not to pay 6 1/4% dividends (interest) from day of deposit to day of withdrawal. Instead, the Board anticipates paying a 6 3/4% dividend on deposits at the end of the quarter as in the past. Under this plan, any money deposited by Feb. 10th and left in the credit union through March 31 sarns a minimum of two months' interest. Contact Lou Gilles for details.
