The Learning Resources Center is located in AC 201. The hours are from 8:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. The telephone number is Ext. 187. Nancy Dickson and Scott Johnson are coordinators.

The center houses cassette tape decks, turntables and amplifier, videocassette player, slide and film strip projectors, and curriculum texts. This hardware is housed in carrels with headphones for private and individual use.

The center also has available videocassettes, slide-tapes, film strips, realia, and records from Gregorian chants to Elton John, including recordings of many of Shakespeare's plays.

The above materials may be checked out for periods up to one week, using the same procedures and penalty fines as the library. Cassette tapes for foreign languages and other disciplines may be reproduced in the center at a cost of 50¢ per tape or free if the student supplies their own tapes.

Ms. Dickson and Mr. Johnson welcome suggestions from students and faculty for advancement and improvement of the center.
