KIMBELS OFFER \$200,000 CHALLENGE

At a news conference on Thursday, Feb. 28, Coastal Chancellor Edward M. Singleton issued the following statement: "It's my pleasure to announce that Mr. and Mrs. William A. Kimbel of Wachesaw Plantation near Murrell's Inlet have offered to donate a challenge gift of \$200-thousand for the completion of Wheelwright Auditorium-if other funds can be raised to match this gift.

"Mr. and Mrs. Kimbel provided the \$1-million gift which began the campaign to construct Wheelwright Auditorium. The residents of the Waccamaw and Grand Strand regions enthusiastically donated an equal amount of funds and we know the community will respond enthusiastically to this new challenge.

"Now, funds are needed to complete the interior of Wheelwright Auditorium and with this challenge gift, the Kimbels once again have demonstrated their generosity and their concern for the quality of life in our area. When this challenge is successfully met, Wheelwright Auditorium will be complete in a manner which will make it a source of pride for the residents of our community."

USC-COASTAL NOW SIGNING UP FOR SHORTCOURSES
