# Alumni Office to update data base

Coastal Carolina alumni are asked to send information such as social security number, academic major, month and year of graduation, employment information, maiden name (if applicable), telephone number, and address to the Alumni Office.

Students who did not graduate from Coastal are considered alumni if they earned at least 15 hours of course credit prior to 1974, or 30 hours of course credit since 1974.

According to Alumni Director Mona Dukes, steps are being taken to locate "lost" alumni so they may become better informed about their alma mater and learn of the opportunities Coastal has to offer.

"We know there are alumni who haven't received information in some time," Dukes said. "They move and don't send us their change of address, or either we have their address prior to graduation and no new information."
