COASTAL AWARDS NOMINATIONS OPEN

Faculty General Excellence Award

Letters have been mailed by the Student Affairs Committee to all seniors with a cumulative G.P.R. of 3.5 or above asking their self-nomination as a candidate for the 1980 Faculty General Excellence Award. This is the College's most prestigious award and will be voted on by faculty during the week of April 14, 1980. Any faculty or staff member aware of a worthy candidate should encourage the student to complete the self-nomination and return it to the Office of the Dean of Student Development by 5:00 PM, Monday, April 7, 1980.

George C. Rogers Award

The deadline for this award has been extended to Wednesday, March 26, 1980 by the Student Affairs Committee. Faculty and staff are invited to nominate students for this award, which is given for cumulative service to the College, regardless of class. Nominations should be received in the Office of the Dean of Student Development by 5:00 PM Wednesday, March 26, 1980.

REGIONAL PERSONNEL OFFICERS CONFERENCE TO MEET AT COASTAL

USC-Coastal Carolina College has been chosen as the site for the 1980 NASPA Region III Chief Student Personnel Officers' Conference, June 15-18, 1980. The 1,500 member institutions, and Region III comprises as 11 state/segment of the nation: Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mexico, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, and Virginia.

Dr. Robert W. Squatriglia, Dean of Student Development of USC-Coastal, is South Carolina state Director or NASPA, member of the Region III Advisory Board, and coordinator of this third annual conference-the first to be held in the state.

The conference will be held on the USC-Coastal Campus, and the Landmark Resort Hotel, Myrtle Beach. Nearly 100 institutions from the 11 state region are expected to participate in this conference, which has been held previously at the University of Louisville and the University of Alabama.

PANEL DISCUSSES FOREIGN POLICY

A faculty panel discussion of American foreign policy is scheduled for Wednesday, March 26th, 12-1 p.m. in Room 106 of the Academic Building.
