COASTAL CELEBRATES 25TH ANNIVERSARY FACULTY URGED TO PARTICIPATE

USC-Coastal Carolina College will officially celebrate its 25th anniversary at 11 a.m., Thursday, April 24th, with ceremonies in front of the Administration Building. Founders, supporters, faculty, administrators, students and the public will be invited to celebrate the successful completion of the college's first quarter-century. Keynote speaker for the celebration will be U.S. Senator Mark Hatfield of Oregon. After the 11:00 ceremony, further activities will continue around campus.

Twenty-fifth Anniversary Committee Chairman Jim Branham asks faculty to reserve their seats for the celebration by contacting ext. 162 or 113 by Thursday, April 17th. This information is necessary to successfully organize the event. Plans call for an informal academic procession. Faculty members will assemble in the Williams-Brice Building by 10:45 a.m. and will march to the convocation in front of the Administration Building at 11:00. There will not be a recessional. All faculty are asked to participate.

Coastal faculty member addressed the public through a variety of forums last week. Dr. Ballou Skinner made a speech about energy to the Surfside Garden City Lions Club; Dr. Richard Dame discussed low-country lifestyles at the Huntington Beach Tourism Commission; Nursing Director Jean Roberts participated in a panel discussion on Legal Aspects of Nursing for the Pee Dee AHEC; Financial Aid Director Will Allred appeared on radio interview programs on WXTL in Myrtle Beach and WLAT in Conway; and Dr. Marshall Parker discussed Coastal's continuing education program in radio broadcasts.

WISEMAN ON SACS TEAM

Coastal's Professor Dennis Wiseman recently served as a SACS (Southern Association of Colleges and Schools) evaluator on an accreditation team in Berkeley County, Moncks Corner, SC. Wiseman reviewed three middle schools, and conducted a system wide district accreditation review. His focus areas were objectives and curriculum design. Such accreditation teams are organized through the State Department of Education, elementary education area.

GUJER HEADS INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

Coastal's Dr. Bruno Gujer has been appointed Director of the International Program at Coastal Carolina College. Dr. Gujer will continue as Foreign Student Counselor. He will also collect and disseminate information on study and teaching opportunities abroad and help Coastal students who desire to complement their course work at a foreign college or university.

The faculty of Coastal Carolina College is encouraged to share with Dr. Gujer any information they may have on foreign colleges and universities, study-and-travel projects, scholarships designed to promote academic exchange, or any other subject along those lines. As Director of the International Program, Dr. Gujer will report to the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs. An International Program Committee will establish guidelines and work with the Director in specific problem areas.

Coastal Carolina Art Students invite faculty, staff and students, to the opening reception of the Spring 1980 Student Art Exhibit to be held on Thursday, April 10, from 12 noon until 2 p.m. in the gallery of the Fine Arts Building.
