

Honorees have been selected from the university's volunteer groups for recognition during this special event. The dinner is open to university volunteer groups, faculty and staff. Echoes of Africa, performed by the professional touring group Columbia Artists Festivals, will be presented Tuesday, Feb. 8 at 7:30 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium. Tickets are \$12; \$5 for students.

The performance offers a glimpse of the African folk origins of America's popular music and dance. Songs, rhythms, and stories kept on the

Georgia Sea Islands and older Piedmont blues from the Virginia Tidewater are paired with kora (harp) music, drumming and solo vocals from West Africa and modern tap.

Echoes of Africa is part of Coastal's nine-event African-American Celebration. The celebration captures the art, history, music, and theater of the African-American culture.

Recycling containers available on campus

The Physical Plant Office announces that recycling containers have been placed on campus by American Refuge Systems (ARS).

- Items which **can** be recycled are:
- All white paper: bond paper, typing paper, copy paper, letterhead stationery, notebook paper. White paper with colored ink also is acceptable.
- Computer printouts: greenbar, bluebar, no bar
- NCR paper
- White envelopes: without windows
- FAX paper

Note: It is not necessary to remove paperclips and staples from paper to be recycled.

Items which **can not** be placed in the containers for recycling include:

- carbon paper
- any colored paper
- newspapers
- cardboard
- napkins
- paper bags
- window envelopes
- file folders

- manilla envelopes
- post-it-notes

The container locations are as follows:

• **EMS Building:** two containers under center hall stairway past switchboard

• **Kimbel Library:** one container in the second floor office area; one container on the first floor near the circulation desk

• Kearns Hall: one container on the second floor near the computer terminal room

• Science Building: one container placed with recycling containers already in use on the first floor

• **Student Center:** one container in the office area on the second floor

• Wall Building: one container at each end of the building on the first floor and two containers in the computer lab.

• Physical Plant, Purchasing/ Warehouse: one container in the Physical Plant Office

Dennis Wiseman has been appointed by Barbara Nielsen, State Superintendent of Education, to a fivemember technical assistance team to work with one of the two school districts in South Carolina recently identified as a "greatest need" district. Districts placed in this category are under a state mandate to implement strategies designed to strengthen their instructional programs and overall operations.

Sally Horner represented Coastal at the annual meeting of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools held in Atlanta, Ga., Dec. 13-17.

Claudia Cleary had an article, entitled "Community Involvement: An Imperative for Action," selected for publication in the Winter 1993 volume of the *Journal* of Social Philosophy, a juried journal published at Trinity University. The article explores the relationship between the choice to act with benevolence towards society and self-actualization. Theories on the notions of action, self, society and duty as found in the works of Aristotle, Hegel, F. H. Bradley and Jean-Paul Sartre are examined.

Steve Hamelman will present "Look Who's Not Talking: The Abuse of Signs in *Kelroy*" at the American Literature Association Convention in San Diego, on June 2. His paper was accepted to represent the Society of Early Americanists.

John Farrelly, Tom Cooke, Sandra Nelson and Jody Davis attended a leadership conference of the South Carolina Alliance for Health, Physical Education, Recreations and Dance which was held in Columbia, Jan. 15. Farrelly, Cooke, Nelson and Davis all serve as officers for the alliance. Sixty participants from South Carolina attended the conference representing the five associations within the SCAHPERD

Alliance.

Alan Case and student Jim Witten recently attended a basketball coaching certification workshop for Special Olympics coaches which was held in Columbia, Jan. 15. This certification enables Case and Witten to prepare a group of local Special Olympic athletes for a major state competition to be held during March in Charleston.

Alan Case and student Marie Holmberg attended a two-day conference on Senior Citizen Programming recently held in Myrtle Beach. The conference, sponsored by the Horry County Council on Aging, dealt with different aspects of sports programming for the Senior Games, which will be hosted by Coastal's HPER Department on April 7 and 8.

Eric Koepfler has been awarded a National Oceanographic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) grant, under NOAA's Coastal Ocean and Estuarine Habitat Research Program. The three-year grant is funded for 250K, and is titled "Salt-marsh geomorphology and ecological development: Influences upon habitat linkages within and across ecosystem boundaries." The grant, which was co-authored by Richard Dame; Daniel Childers, National Marine Fisheries Service, Galveston, Texas; and Bjorn Kjerfve, USC Columbia; will be administered by Coastal's Center for Marine and Wetland Studies. Koepfler also had two journal articles published recently. "Variability of sediment pore water DOC in seagrass bed and unvegetated habitats in a southern Texas Estuary" was published in Estuaries and "Spatial and temporal bacterioplankton dynamics during destratification of the James River Estuary, Virginia" was published in Marine Ecology Progress Series. 28
