CREDIT UNION NOW CHARGING 15% INTEREST

The USC Federal Credit Union is now charging 15% interest on loans. This change will affect all personal loan applications processed by the credit union since April 7, 1980. Interest is computed on the unpaid balance at the rate of 1.25% per month.

LIBRARY USE POLICY NOW IN EFFECT

Persons who are residents of South Carolina may apply for borrowers' cards which enable them to have up to two books checked out at any given time. Children under the age of fourteen are required to have a parent sign the application for a borrower's card and must be accompanied by an adult (eighteen and over) each time they visit the library.

Students are best served on an individual basis, because of factors relating to the staff size and physical facilities. Efforts will be made to accommodate classes or groups in accordance with the following guidelines:

- (1) Arrangements should be made at least a week in advance by contacting either the library director or the librarian in charge of public services.
- (2) The group will consist of no more than fifteen (15) students.
- (3) The group will be accompanied by a teacher or other responsible adult.
- (4) The visit will be scheduled to take place between the hours of 8:30 a.m. and 10:00 a.m. or 1:00 p.m. and 4:00 p.m.
- (5) Unacceptable group conduct during a visit will be considered a basis for denying permission for subsequent visits.
