COASTAL ATHLETES, COACHES WINNERS

The Chanticleers baseball squad goes to the NAIA Regional Playoffs in Bluefield, W.Va. this week as NAIA District VI champions. In a three day contest (May 15-17) Coastal will face teams from Kentucky, North Carolina and West Virginia. The championship game scheduled for Saturday will test the winners of the playoffs to see who goes to the Nationals. "Hitman" Larry Carr and his Chants compiled another outstanding regular season with a record of 33 wins and 8 losses.

A week later Coastal Tennis Coach Marshall Parker will again take Coastal to the NAIA Tennis Nationals in Kansas City. Coastal netters Lester Herbert of Charleston and Eddie Gayon of The Phillipines will be representing Coastal as the NAIA District VI Doubles Champions at the Nationals. They'll be competing in singles and doubles matches under the competent coaching of Dr. Parker.

Congratulations to Coastal Coach Tom Cooke!Cooke has been name NAIA District VI Tennis Coach of the Year.Like his fellow coaches Carr and Parker, Cooke will be taking the Chariticleers Golfers to the nationals. On May 23rd, Cooke will take his golf club to Saginaw Valley, Mich., where the Chants will compete in the NAIA National Golf Tournament.

HORRY, GEORGETOWN STUDENTS COMPETE IN COASTAL CAROLINA MATH CONTEST

More than 300 students from ten high schools in Horry and Georgetown Counties will compete in the second annual USC-Coastal Carolina College/M.A.C. Mathematics Contest on Tuesday, May 13th at the Coastal Campus. The contest is co-sponsored by the college of the Mathematics Advancement Council.

"The contest will consist of one-hour written mathematics examination," explains Dr. Gene Collins of Coastal Carolina College, the contest chairman. "The examination is designed to show how much students have learned about mathematics. It's sort of a measure of their achievement in math and their ability to handle new problems."

According to Collins, students will be competing for individual awards on two levels. Level I is for students taking Algebra I or Geometry. Level II is for students in Algebra II, Advanced Algebra and Trigonometry. The schools will also compete for a team award. The top three scores on each level will be added together to determine the team score.

The contest will be organized by Coastal's School of Mathematics and Computer Services and the Mathematics Advancement Council of Horry and Georgetown Counties.

COASTAL GIVES SOUTH CAROLINA UNIQUE SPORTFISHING EXPERIENCE

The Coastal Carolina College fishing club is involved in another innovation in sportfishing competition and education. As a result, South Carolina's Marion and Moultrie lakes, "Santee-Cooper Country," will be the scene of a different kind of fishing competition May 19-21. University students from Canada, New England, and the South will combine competitive fishing with seminars centered on striped bass and catfish in the Santee-Cooper Intercollegiate, a sport seminar fishing seminar and match.

This will be the first intercollegiate fishing match and seminar held in fresh water in South Carolina. Yale University, Western Ontario University, and Coastal Carolina College of the University of South Carolina will be the participating teams. The event is being sponsored by Santee-Cooper Country, a fivecounty promotional commission which is directed by J. Charles Lehmann. Coastal Carolina College's fishing club helped organize the event as a fresh water version of its annual salt water fishing match and seminar, the Coastal Carolina Invitational.

The Santee-Cooper Intercollegiate will feature evening programs open to the public at no charge. On Monday evening, May 19th, Edward Migdalski, director of outdoor education at Yale University, will give a presentation on the history of intercollegiate sport fishing. Migdalski is the author of a number of books on the sport fishes of the world. He also founded the first international intercollegiate sport fishing competition thirty years ago. The event, now known as the International University Sport Fishing Match, is held annually in Nova Scotia, Canada. Migdalski's Yale team has also competed in South Carolina in the annual competition sponsored by Coastal Carolina College.

On May 21st, the students in the Santee-Cooper Intercollegiate will fish for striped bass and catfish with professional guides. In the evening, Miller White, district biologist for the South Carolina Wildlife Department, will give a presentation on the past, present, and future of striped bass and catfish angling in the Santee-Cooper lakes. This program will also be open to the public free of charge.
