SCHOOL OF SCIENCE GETS LARGE GRANT

The school of Science at Coastal Carolina College has been awarded a grant of \$213,000 from the National Science Foundation, according to Coastal Chancellor Edward M. Singleton.

The award was presented by the Foundation's Comprehensive Assistance to Undergraduate Science Education Program, known as "CAUSE" to educators.

"We are delighted to receive this tremendous assistance by the National Science Foundation," said Chancellor Singleton. "The faculty members at Coastal who proposed this grant should be commended. It will greatly enchance Coastal's science program and will enable us to upgrade and continue our educational services to the community."

Dr. Colleen A. Lohr, Associate Professor of Biology at Coastal, authored the proposal and will be its project director. Lohr says the \$213,000 award will be used to improve the science curriculum at Coastal and to develop multi-disciplinary laboratories in the college's proposed Science Center, due to enter construction this year.

"Over the next three years," Lohr says, "the School of Science will design a Basic Skills Laboratory for beginning science students and will design a Common Instrument Room which will house sophisticated laboratory equipment purchased through the grant."

"This is the first large, competitive grant awarded to the college's science program," says Dr. Richard Moore, Dean of the School of Science. "The faculty members at Coastal are excited about the possibility of an expanded science curriculum to serve the needs of all the students at Coastal," he says.

Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs Dr. Roy Talbert says the National Science Foundation grant will have a dramatic effect on the school's science program and will be important to students enrolled in the sciences at Coastal.

"The scientific equipment this grant will allow us to purchase will substantially upgrade both out teaching and research possibilities," he explains. "Not only will our students have a valuable experience with the new equipment, but our faculty will have an opportunity to further their research projects. The work put into this project by Coastal's Dr. Lohr ranks as the greatest contribution to Coastal by a single faculty member to date this year."

The National Science Foundation's CAUSE program, which funds about 70 projects across the nation each year, is designed to strengthen resources from undergraduate science education, improve the nation's science instruction, and enhance science programs.

USC-COASTAL CAROLINA SURVEYS LOCAL BUSINESSES

Businesses in the Conway, Georgetown and Grand Strand areas are undergoing some close scrunity in a special project conducted jointly by USC-Coastal Carolina and USC-Columbia. The market study is being made to determine what business related seminars and programs are needed and desired by the business community in the three areas.

Directing the marketing survey will be Dr. Bill Morngenroth of USC-Columbia. A former Colorado cowboy and intelligence agent in World War II, Morgenroth is now a professor of Marketing at USC. A native of Ohio, he holds a Bachelor's Degree and a Master's Degree from the University of Michigan, a Master's from the University of Colorado and a Ph.D. from Pittsburg University. He will be organizing the business survey through August 20.

"We're trying to determine the needs of the business communities in Conway, Georgetown and the Grand Strand," Morgenroth explains. "We're trying to find out what programs the business community needs and wants, so that the faculty at Coastal and USC-Columbia can develop special business programs and seminars. These programs will be tailor-made to serve the business needs of the community, so the community will benefit from the programs. The survey, of course, will determine what subjects should be taught. Coastal's students will also benefit by learning more about the local business community."
