OCEAN VIEW FOUNDATION AWARDS \$24,000 IN SCHOLARSHIPS TO LOCAL STUDENTS

The Ocean View Memorial Foundation has awarded \$24,000 in educational scholarships to 20 students from the Waccamaw-Grand Strand Area, foundation officials have announced.

According to Dr. Holmes B. Springs and Mrs. Margaret Morgan, foundation directors and members of the Ocean View Memorial Scholarship Committee, the foundation has made its annual scholarship awards to students from Myrtle Beach, Conway, Surfside Beach, North Myrtle Beach and Socastee. Students planning to attend USC-Coastal Carolina College will receive scholarships of \$1,000, while students planning to attend distant colleges and universities will receive scholarships of \$1,500.

Twelve of the scholarship recipients will attend Coastal Carolina College, while eight others will attend various other institutions. Scholarships were awarded to students planning to attend Coastal, Winthrop College, Yale University, USC-Columbia, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, the Medical College of Charleston and Benedict College.
