## COASTAL FTE AT 1778

Coastal Carolina Admissions Director Marsh Myers says the final enrollment data for fall 1980 has been compiled and verified. "With the addition of MBAFB, Coastal recorded a dramatic increase in enrollment this fall," he says. "Subtracting the AFB enrollment, Coastal still recorded a significant enrollment."

Myers says the college recorded an on-campus fall enrollment of 2,036 students, which was 16 more than the admissions office had projected. The fall 1980 FTE is 1,778 which, Myers says, is one point higher than the admissions office projection of 1,777.
