Conference to focus on international tourism issues



"Managing and Marketing Tourism in the International Environment," a conference designed to help hospitality-based businesses and organizations attract and serve

international visitors and manage multicultural work forces, will be held Friday, Nov. 1 and Saturday, Nov. 2 at the Embassy Suites at Kingston Plantation in Myrtle Beach.

The cost of the conference, which is sponsored by Coastal Carolina University and the Myrtle Beach Area Hospitality Association, is \$65.

The conference's keynote speaker is Horst Schulze, who was president and chief operating officer of the Ritz-Carlton Hotel Company from 1983 to 2002. During Schulze's tenure, the Ritz-Carlton expanded from one property to more than 40 worldwide in 41 countries and twice won the prestigious Malcolm Baldridge National Quality Award. A recognized leader in the service world, Schulze has been instrumental in reshaping the concept of customer service in the hospitality and the service industries.

Other featured conference speakers include: Chinny Carothers, director of marketing for Travel South USA, an


Coastal takes leading role in Heart Walk

Coastal Carolina University had a significant involvement in the annual American Heart Walk and Fitness Festival, held Saturday, Oct. 19 in Myrtle Beach. Chaired by Coastal President Ronald R. MAT information sessions scheduled

Coastal Carolina University's College of Education will hold two information sessions in November for people interested in earning a Master of Arts in Teaching (MAT) degree. Sessions are scheduled for Monday, Nov. 4 in Kearns Hall 109 and on Thursday, Nov. 7 in Kearns Hall 110. Both sessions will be held from 5 to 6 p.m. and will provide information on admission to the program, curriculum requirements and teacher certification.

The MAT program offers graduatelevel programs of study that lead to teacher certification in selected areas. The MAT is typically begun after the completion of the bachelor's degree and usually takes one academic year and two summer sessions to complete.

Programs leading to teacher certification in South Carolina are available for grades 7 to 12 in English, mathematics, science and social studies. Programs in art, foreign languages (French and Spanish) and music for grades PreK to 12 are available.
