# USC-COASTAL TO HOLD FOREIGN FILM FESTIVAL

USC-Coastal Carolina College's foreign student community, the Coastal Council for Internationals, is sponsoring a festival of foreign films which will be shown at the college on 12 dates from Oct. 16 through April 23rd.

"We feel that it is our task to familiarize the people in our community with the cultures of other people," says Dr. Bruno Gujer, director of the International Program at the college. "We are now beginning our first international film series, which consists of excellent and internationally acclaimed feature films."

Beginning Oct. 16th, the foreign films will be shown at 8 p.m. on Thursdays in the Coastal Carolina college center. Student tickets for the 16-film series are \$5 each. Faculty and Coastal Council members may buy tickets for \$7 and the general public can buy a season ticket for \$10. Admission at the box office is \$2. Ticket information is available at the college Student Development Office (448-1481 or 347-3161) or from Dr. Bruno Guier.

The proceeds from the film series will be used to assist the foreign student program at the college.

The film series includes: Germany's Every Man for Himself and God Against All (Oct. 16); a halloween trilogy (Oct. 30-31): Iphigenia from Greece (Nov. 16); Rififi of France (Nov. 20); Henry V (Dec. 4) of England; the American film, Death in Venice (Jan. 22); Japan's Seven Samuari (Feb. 5); Brazil's Black Orpheus (Feb. 19); the American film Catholics (Mar. 5); Ashes and Diamonds of Poland (April 9); and The Devils from England (April 23).

All foreign language films will feature subtitles in English.

## USC-COASTAL TO SPONSOR PHOTOGRAPHY COURSE

The Continuing Education Office of USC-Coastal Carolina College is offering a special course in amateur photography 6-8 p.m. on Tuesdays Oct. 7 - Dec. 16 in room 204 of the college Academic Building.

"This course is designed to take the mystery out of photography." explains Director of Continuing Education Dr. Sally Z. Hare. "You'll learn how to take clear, sharp imaginative photographs without investing in expensive, sophisticated equipment."

Hare says the course will cover cameras, film, exposure, lenses, lighting, composition and darkroom techniques.

"It's expecially designed for users of 35mm cameras, but if you have an instamatic or a polaroid, you can still learn a lot," Hare says.

The instructor for the course, which is entitled "Beginning Photography," is Steve Candal, a professional photographer. The class will meet on 10 Tuesday evenings and tuition is \$50, which includes all materials except film and camera. (Although film will be provided for the first class.)

The course is limited to 10 persons. You may register by calling the Office of Continuing Education at the college (448-1481 or 347-3161). The registration deadline is 5 p.m., Oct. 6th.
