GOLF TOURNEY WILL AID EDUCATIONAL FOUNDATION

The Fourth Annual Coastal Educational Foundation Golf Tournament will be played Saturday, Nov. 1 at the Myrtle Beach National Golf Club.

Last year's tournament recorded more than 100 amateur players teeing up for the tournament, which provides support for higher education at USC-Coastal Carolina College. Tournament Chairman Darcy Carr and Tournament Coordinator Bill Baxley expect another successful tournament this year, they say.

"We're expecting a lot of folks to have a lot of fun for a good cause," Baxley said. "We are grateful to Myrtle Beach National Golf Club for donating one of its excellent courses for the event. The past three tournaments have been great successes and this year's event should be even better," he added.

The tournament will feature four-man teams with prizes awarded for team competition, low gross and low net scores. "All the proceeds will go toward improving higher education in the area through USC-Coastal Carolina College," said Carr. "Players should register their foursome early by calling the Office of College Relations at the college. We are impressed with the support this tournament has received in the community and we're glad it has become a popular annual event with Grand Strand and South Carolina golfers," he added.

The tournament will begin at 9 a.m. with a shotgun start and teams are requested to be at the course by 8:30 a.m. Anyone who wants to participate should call the college at 448-1481 or 347-3161.

USC-COASTAL SPONSORS BASKETBALL COACHES CLINIC

High school basketball coaches, recreation directors and youth program directors will have a chance to tune up their basketball coaching skills in a special basketball coaches clinic scheduled for USC-Coastal Carolina College near Myrtle Beach.

The clinic, scheduled for 7-10 p.m. on Oct. 28 and 30 and on Nov. 4 and 6, will be taught by USC-Coastal Carolina College Head Basketball Coach Russ Bergman.

Bergman, who is in his sixth year of coaching at Coastal, was a basketball letterman in the late 1960's at LSU; played semi-pro ball in the Continental Basketball Association and was an assistant coach under Press Maravich at Appalachian State University. At Coastal, Bergman has guided the Chanticleers to three district playoffs and is the new chairman of the basketball committee for NAIA District VI.

The topics Bergman will teach at the clinic will include practice organization, fundamentals in delaying offense, special situations, man-to-man defense, zones, fast break, passing game and set offenses, offense verses zones, traps and presses. The clinic offers 1.2 Continuing Education Units and has a fee of \$35, which includes tickets to the Nov. 1 USC-Coastal Carolina and USC-Columbia intra-squad scrimmage at Coastal's Kimbel Gymnasium.

College Dining Service Banquet Manual and College Center Reservation(s)

A College Dining Service Banquet Manual, developed by Dining Service Director Robert Greer, has been distributed to each administrative office on the campus (deans and directors). The manual is for general campus use and details menus, prices, and services for a broad range of activities. Each member of the College Community is urged to become familiar with the manual. A limited number of additional copies are available from Bob Greer's office.

Also included in the manual are College Center reservations instructions and a sample of a reservation form. Space reservations are separate from dining arrangements, and all space arrangements are processed by the College Center Office (College Center 206, Ext. 206). Space in the building should be reserved not less than five (5) working days prior to the date of the planned event, insofar as is possible. Space is at a premium in the College Center and you are urged to submit your space requests as well in advance of events as possible.

Service of alcohol on the campus in general and the College Center in particular is restricted by state law and University/College policies. Information on alcohol policies may be obtained from the Office of Student Activities, College Center 206, and/or the 1979-80 Coastal Community.
