COASTAL BUSINESS STUDENTS SEE 'REAL WORLD'

For 14 senior business majors from Coastal Carolina College, it was a first-hand look at the world of big business - outside the classroom.

The students were members of the Coastal Carolina College Atlanta Industry Field Study, a college travel seminar which annually visits major business centers in Atlanta to discuss business developments with industry executives.

The students, who recently returned from Atlanta, are now analyzing what they saw through classroom discussions.

The field study was developed by Coastal Associate Chancellor for College Relations Bill Baxley, who modeled the program after a similiar travel seminar at the Industrial College of The Armed Forces. Baxley, a retired U.S. Army Colonel, taught managment studies at the Industrial College and thought the field studies at the Industrial College would prove successful at Coastal.

"The Atlanta Industry Field Study at USC-Coastal Carolina College is designed to broaden the business student's perspective and to help the student make the transition from the academic world to the 'real world' of business," Baxley explains. "The program exposed the students to business problems, management solutions and business techniques. The students have direct contact with business executives in Atlanta and in the local community, which gives the students insight into what the world of business is all about.

In Atlanta, the students visit the Atlanta Mayor's office, the Greater Atlanta Chamber of Commerce: the Georgia World Congress; Citizens and Southern National Bank; the Coca Cola Company; the Federal Reserve Bank; Delta Airlines.
