The Coastal Carolina Soccer team finished the season with a 12-4-2 record and earned runner-up in District 6. Additionally, the Chants earned national ranking this season and had two players in the national rankings as well. Brian Knoess earned a spot in Team High Scorer and Individual High Scorer while Bill Dickens took honors for saves and shutouts.

Coach Farrelly was pleased with his team's performance for the season. Although the loss of the District championship was a disappointment he concluded, "The best team won."

The Coastal Carolina Golf team, playing mostly their Freshman recruits to give them tournament experience before the start of the season finished no worse than sixth place in any of the tournaments. Coach Cooke indicated he was pleased with the overall performance of his team.

Plagued with injuries the Lady Chants' Volleyball team finished the season with a 6-17 record. Coach Meade's very young team played well and showed a great deal of potential but were unable to keep up with the more experienced AIAW teams in their conference. Coach Meade remarked, "Our biggest weekness was in our hitter department and we hope to rectify that situation through more experience by next season."
