Russian cartoonist's work to be displayed in Admissions Gallery

In conjunction with the university's presentation of the St. Petersburg Ballet, an exhibit by Russian cartoonist, circus artist and comedian Alexander Aleshichev will be on display in the Admissions Building Gallery on Thursday, Sept. 7 through Friday, Sept. 22. The exhibit, My World, opens with a reception Thursday, Sept. 7 from 2 to 4 p.m. Aleshichev, who was a caricaturist clown for EuroCircus, will be present for the opening. The exhibit and reception are free and open to the public. Aleshichev began drawing at age three and at age 12 entered art school. While studying the creative arts, Aleshichev developed a talent for drawing humorous cartoons and caricatures. His caricatures were first published in 1958. He has made portraits of hundreds of celebrities including Russian cosmonauts, stars of the Bolshoi Opera Theatre, American hockey and basketball players, and more.

His paintings have appeared in major periodicals and newspapers in Russia and abroad including

The International Collection of Finest Caricatures and Cartoons. He is well known for his speed and accuracy of drawing cartoons and caricatures: a typical caricature takes approximately 5 to 30 seconds.

Aleshichev graduated from the Federal College of Circus Performing Arts and became an artistic performer in the circus appearing as a clown, juggler, acrobat, pantomime artist and eccentric painter. He can draw with his mouth and both hands simultaneously. His 25-year career as a circus artist has been recorded in the Encyclopedia of Circus Performing Arts of Russia.

Affordable health services for students at Coastal

In an effort to provide students with accessible and affordable medical care, the university has implemented a comprehensive student health service.

The health service is mandatory for all students residing in university housing and is optional for nonresident students. The cost for this service is \$50 and has been included in the fees for students enrolled in university housing.

A registered nurse will be available on campus weekdays from 8:30 a.m. to 5 p.m. to respond to student health needs. In addition, a 24-hour answering service for immediate health concerns will be implemented. Primary health care will be provided by Coastal Family Medicine, P.C., a family physician medical practice located in close proximity to campus.

The student health service includes nursing assessment, unlimited visits to Coastal Family Medicine, P.C. for illness and injury evaluations by physicians after nursing consultation, and more. The service, however, is not a student health insurance policy. Health insurance is available for all university students at a reasonable cost with low deductibles.

Steve Hamelman's review of Robert Gale's Cultural Encyclopedia of the 1850's was published in the most recent volume of South Atlantic Review. Hamelman's "Biker's Lament," a meditation in prose and verse, was published in the September/October issue of Dirt Rag, a national magazine devoted to mountain biking. Hamelman also is in the process of founding the Coastal Mountain

Tom Kantz presented an invited paper, entitled "Phylogenetic relationships among the Pleurastrophyceae and Chlorophyceae (Chlorophyta) based on rRNA gene sequence data and non-molecular data," at the Coccoid Green Algae Symposium of the 1995 Annual Meeting of the Phycological Society of America, Aug. 6-10, in Breckenridge, Colo.

Kantz also was an invited participant in a USDAfunded workshop on the current status of the phylogeny of the green algae, Aug. 11-12 in Breckenridge, Colo.

Subhash Saxena participated in "CALCULUS REFORM," a workshop sponsored by the National Science Foundation which was held recently at Emory University. Saxena was actively involved in seminar sessions dealing

with various calculus reforms in the United States.

Kathy Taylor presented a paper, entitled "Organizing and advising undergraduate research in ecology with little time, money, and equipment: a case study from Coastal Carolina University," at the 1995 Annual Meeting of the Ecological Society of America, July 30-Aug. 3, in Snowbird, Utah. While attending the meeting, Taylor also judged student papers eligible for the Braun and Buell ESA student presentation awards

Taylor was one of the 11 participants from across the United States in a National Science Foundation Undergraduate Faculty Enhancement Workshop in Pollination Biology held at Rocky Mountain Biological Laboratory in Gothic, Colo., Aug. 10-24. The workshop leaders were internationally known ecologists David Inouye of the University of Maryland, Carol Kearns of the University of Colorado in Boulder, James Thomson of the State University of New York at Stony Brook, and Nick Waser of the University of California at Riverside.

Kathy Taylor and Tom Kantz have been notified that their coauthored paper, "Undergraduate Research Opportunities for All: A case study from the Department of Biology, Coastal Carolina University," will be published in the September 1995 issue of Council on Undergraduate Research Quarterly.
