#### COASTAL REQUESTS PROBE

The administration of USC-Coastal Carolina College has asked the South Carolina State Auditor's Office and the State Law Enforcement Division to conduct an investigation into the expenditure of student activity funds at the college.

College officials requested an investigation of student activity expenditures after an internal examination of student activity records by Coastal Carolina College personnel indicated a possible accounting descrepancy.

Following its examination of the records, the administration of Coastal Carolina College asked the University of South Carolina Department of Internal Audits to conduct further examination of student activity expenditures.

In response to the college administration's request for an investigation, the USC Department of Internal Audits recommended an official investigation, which is now being conducted by the State Law Enforcement Division.

When the investigation is completed, its conclusions will be released to the public.

#### **COMPUTER COURSES OFFERED**

In order to provide an opportunity for increased utilization of the batch and interactive computing facilities at Coastal Carolina College, the School of Mathematics and Computer Service is offering four short courses in Computer Programming for the faculty. These courses will be ten-hour courses offered on Thursday afternoons from 2:30 pm to 4:30 pm for five weeks each. The courses will introduce the VSPC interactive computing system and the languages: BASIC, FORTRAN, PL/I, and PASCAL in that order.

The programming language syllabus will be the same for each of the courses. Beginning in BASIC and continuing through the other languages, the same four computer programs will be developed. First, there will be a program to read data and compute the mean, variance, and standard deviation. The next program will be a record-keeping program similar to a payroll or grade records, followed by a simulation using random numbers. The last program will be an amortization schedule which is useful in any installment buying situation.
