## USC-COASTAL AWARDS DEGREES

Parents, relatives and friends of approximately 200 graduates of USC-Coastal Carolina College watched last Saturday as the college awarded academic degrees in 1981 commencement ceremonies.

The college presented Bachelor of Arts degrees in seven majors; Bachelor of Science degrees in seven majors; Associate of Science degrees and Associate of Arts degrees.

Commencement was 10:30 a.m., in the Williams Brice Building on the campus of USC-Coastal Carolina College. The one-hour ceremony was followed by a reception for graduates and guests sponsored by the Coastal Carolina College Alumni Association.

The Honorable Ramon Schwartz, Jr., the Speaker of the South Carolina House of Representatives, delivered the keynote address at the commencement. Schwartz succeeded former House Speaker Rex Carter into the Speakership last year. He is a four-term member of the House Judiciary Committee, who was first elected to the House from Sumter in 1968. Since 1974, he has been reelected without opposition.

## MYRTLE BEACH AREA PROMOTION GETS NATIONWIDE ATTENTION

A unique fishing match and seminar held annually in the Myrtle Beach area has been featured in an internationally circulated magazine. The May issue of **Salt Water Sportsman** has devoted four pages to a story by Coastal's Don Millus about the Coastal Carolina Invitational, the oldest intercollegiate fishing match and seminar in the United States.

The Invitational is an annual presentation of the fishing club of U.S.C. - Coastal Carolina College in cooperation with the Waccamaw Chapter of the South Carolina Wildlife Federation, Springmaid Pier, and local businesses and fishing interests. Students from colleges throughout the United States and Canada take part in three days of fishing and seminars on sportfishing.

Little River and Murrells Inlet are the ports used by student competitors from schools such as Western Ontario, Yale, U.N.C.-Wilmington, and Pembroke State.

The article in **Salt Water Sportsman** pointed out the importance of events such as the Coastal Carolina Invitational to the future of sportfishing. The role in the Invitational of internationally known experts such as George Reiger and Dr. Gene Huntsman was also stressed, as well as the fact that the public is invited to all the seminars held at Springmaid Beach and hosted by the Leroy Springs Company.
