USC PRESIDENT TO MEET WITH COASTAL FACULTY

A special faculty meeting with President Holderman has been scheduled for Tuesday, September 29, at 2:45 p.m. in Wheelwright Auditorium. This will be a very important question and answer session with the University's President and will be held prior to and in conjunction with our annual faculty/staff reception scheduled for the Dunes Golf and Beach Club.

FISHING TOURNEY PLANNED

The Coastal Carolina Invitational, the international fishing match sponsored by USC-Coastal Carolina College, is scheduled for Sept. 30 - Oct. 3.

The international fishing tournament will pit Yale University, Princeton University and Western Ontario University of London, Ontario, against USC-Coastal Carolina College, UNC-Wilmington, and Pembroke State University in a week of fishing competition on the Grand Strand.

The organizer of the intercollegiate fishing competition, Coastal Carolina College professor Don Millus, says the competition is the first of its kind in the nation.

"This is the first fishing tournament in the country to stress both education and tag-and-release competition," he said. "It's also the first salt water intercollegiate seminar to be run in the country. It's a unique kind of college competition and it's good for South Carolina to bring college teams from Canada and the Northeast down to the Myrtle Beach area."

The tournament, originally scheduled for October, will be Sept. 30 - Oct. 3, with a Gulf Stream tagging trip scheduled Friday, Oct. 2. The offshore competition will be hosted by Myrtle Beach area charter boat companies: Capt. Bill Moeller's New Capt. Bill and Capt. Tommy Sing's Flying Fisher.

The fishing competition also includes free public seminars on sportfishing, open to anyone. The seminars are scheduled for 7:30 p.m., Sept. 30 and Oct. 1, in the cafeteria at Springmaid Beach in Myrtle Beach. Speakers at the seminars will include *Field and Stream* magazine's George Reiger and Dr. Richard Moore, a marine biologist from USC-Coastal Carolina College.

HELLO, DOLLY AT WHEELWRIGHT

One of the most successful musicals in stage history, "Hello, Dolly!" has been scheduled for presentation at Wheelwright Auditorium for the 9th, 10th, and 12th of October, with performances scheduled at 8:00 p.m.

"Hello Dolly!" continued to draw thronged audiences on Broadway for more than five years, and became one of the long-run record-holders of all time.

Based by Michael Stewart on Thornton Wilder's straight farce, "The Matchmaker", and with songs by Jerry Herman, "Hello, Dolly!" will have Carolyn Cox (Dolly) in its central role of the nosey, pushing, meddling, effervescent marriagebroker with a determination to match her most eligible client to herself.

Rob Taylor will play the role of Vandergelder, Dolly's balky customer, who never has a chance of escape. The time is the 1890's. A grouchy fellow who terrorizes his clerks, Vandergelder has one undeniable virtue in Dolly's eyes - he is "half-a-millionaire."

Complications in Dolly's designs arise when Vandergelder's two clerks, wearied of their seven-days-a-week job, light out for a fling in New York on the day their boss has gone there to be introduced to Mrs. Malloy, from whom Dolly means to deflect him.

They all keep running into each other and this requires the truant clerks to hide in closets and enter into other hilarious confusions and deceptions.

It is in a famous restaurant scene that the waiters welcome back their long-absent friend. They shake the rafters by singing "Hello, Dolly!" to her, as she descends the staircase in bejeweled elegance. She makes one of the most memorable entrances of the American musical stage.

In addition to Carolyn Cox (Dolly) and Rob Taylor (Vandergelder) as the exuberant matchmaker and the man she means to snare, the large cast will include Joyce Parker as Mrs. Malloy, Jeffrey Zachery and Curt Skinner (Cornelius and Barnaby) as the runaway clerks; Kathy Clayton (Ermengarde) as Vandergelder's cherished niece; Donna Menz, Christie Karavan and Sean Casey (Ernestine, Minnie, Judge). The cast also includes Kevin Ferguson, Don Gamble and others. The director is Thomas E. Jones. The musical director is Bill Hamilton and the orchestra director is Marsh Myers, who will be leading a 19-man orchestra.

FUTURIST SPEAKS OCT. 6

On Tuesday, October 6, Dr. Robert Bundy, nationally known educational planning consultant and futurist, will speak at 4:00 at Wheelwright Auditorium on the USC-Coastal Carolina campus. The public is invited, with a special invitation to teachers, Coastal Carolina faculty and students, high school students, and anyone interested in education.

From Buffalo, N. Y., Dr. Bundy specializes in helping people think imaginatively about how our world is changing and about the kinds of human skills needed now to cope with the future.

He will also address principals, district administration and instruction staffs, School Board members, and Coastal Carolina education professors at 2:00, October 6, at the Conway High School auditorium.
