SUPERVISORY LEADERSHIP. Supervisors will assess their individual leadership styles and gain a greater understanding of the factors which affect employee motivation. Participants will consider communication skills as they relate to supervisory leadership. Included in this session will be an update on supervisors' responsibilities in accommodating the handicapped and dealing with sexual harassment problems.

POSITIVE DISCIPLINE will enable supervisors to build a daily program which will help their subordinates reach and maintain high standards of performance. They will learn ways to encourage, correct and otherwise improve the behavior of people for whom they are responsible. These techniques will insure that employee problems are solved effectively and in compliance with University guidelines. Included will be a review of relevant USC policies. In summary, the workshop will demonstrate practical ways to make discipline both positive and productive.
