## Fall registration scheduled for Aug. 19 to 21

Registration for the 1996 fall semester will be held Monday, Aug. 19 through Wednesday, Aug. 21. Students may register from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Aug. 19 and 20, and from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Aug. 21. Fall semester classes for the regular session begin Thursday, Aug. 22.

Prior to registering, new students must be admitted through the Office of Admissions. For admissions information, contact the Office of Admissions at extension 2026.

Students may register for classes in the following areas of study: accounting, art studio, biology, chemistry, computer science, dramatic arts, early childhood education, elementary education, English, finance, history, interdisciplinary studies, management, marketing, marketing/cooperative golf management, marine science, applied mathematics, physical education, political science, psychology, gerontology (certificate), secondary education and

sociology. Minor degrees are offered in more than 20 areas of study including journalism, which will be offered for the first time beginning in fall 1996.

## Palmetto Fellows Scholarship recipient to attend Coastal

John M. Watson of Pinopolis, S.C., recipient of a Palmetto Fellows Scholarship for academic year 1996-1997, will begin pursuing a bachelor's degree at Coastal Carolina University in the fall.

The Palmetto Fellows Scholarship was established by the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education to foster scholarship among the state's post-secondary students and to retain outstanding South Carolina high school graduates in the state through awards based on scholarship and achievement. Recipients are chosen on the basis of their PSAT/SAT scores, grade point averages, class rank,

participation in extracurricular activities, leadership abilities and letters of recommendation.

Watson is eligible to receive a scholarship award of \$5,000, which is renewable annually for up to four years if eligibility criteria are met. The amount of the scholarship is determined by the South Carolina Commission on Higher Education.

Watson grew up in Pinopolis and graduated from Berkeley County High School in the spring of 1996. He is the second Palmetto Scholar who has chosen Coastal Carolina University for the 1996-1997 year. ♦

## High school students complete College Connection Program

For six weeks, Coastal Carolina University has been home to 32 rising high school seniors from Georgetown, Horry and Williamsburg counties participating in College Connection, an academic program aimed at providing students who might not otherwise consider higher education with an opportunity to participate in college preparatory activities.

The program provides participants with on-campus living experiences, life skills training and career exploration while engaging in academic studies. Students were chosen based on recommendations by high school guidance counselors.

While on the Coastal campus, students have taken classes in beginning algebra, English/reading, career planning and computer science. They also have attended weekly lectures on various topics and have worked in campus offices five hours a week. The students also have visited Brookgreen Gardens, Conway Hospital, Wilmington, local libraries and other places of interest.

According to College Connection coordinator Thomas Isekenege, the goal of the program is not only to educate the students but also to expose them to the cultural and professional benefits of higher education. "It has been an exciting and fun six weeks for the participants and I hope that the knowledge and experience they have acquired this summer will help

make their senior years of high school more meaningful," said Isekenege.

To fund the program, Isekenege received a \$106,262 grant from the Waccamaw Private Industry Council on behalf of the U.S. Department of Labor.

## Phil and Phriends at Festival of Music & Art

Philip Powell will lead an ensemble featuring several Coastal music faculty members in *Phil and Phriends, Part Deux*, in the final performance of the Festival of Music & Art, scheduled for Monday, Sept. 2 at 7:30 p.m. at All Saints Waccamaw Episcopal Church in Pawleys Island.

Among the artists performing in the program will be tenor David Bankston, who joins the Coastal faculty this semester as assistant professor of music; Charles Jones Evans, who recently assumed a dual appointment as conductor and music director of the Long Bay Symphony and as Coastal's Artist-in-Residence; and violinist Nan Hudson, instructor of music. Their selections, with piano accompaniment by Powell, will include works by Rachmaninoff, Strauss, Schumann, Barber and Brahms.

Bankston also will appear as part of the festival with lyric soprano Tiffany Callahan in a program called *Cabaret Under the Stars* on Sunday, Sept. 1 at 7:30 p.m. at Brookgreen Gardens. They will perform a repertoire of pop, Big Band and Broadway classics, accompanied by the Jazz Misfits.

## Transportation Department changes implemented

The university has contracted with Enterprise Rent-A-Car to provide vehicles for use by departments making requests to Coastal's Transportation Department, effective July 1, 1996.

Specific regulations will apply for departments requesting a vehicle.

- Sarah Rabon will be the campus contact and will handle all reservation correspondence with the car rental agency.
- Rentals are not to exceed 14 days due to insurance restrictions.
- The driver listed on the Enterprise paperwork will be responsible for the vehicle.
- All drivers must be at least 21 years of age and have a driver's record on file at the transportation office.
- The driver's license number with the expiration date must be on the vehicle reservation request when submitted.
- Rental vehicles will continue to be picked up at the transportation office on campus.
- Enterprise will deliver the rental vehicle to the transportation office with a full tank of gasoline. The vehicle also must be returned to Enterprise with a full tank of gasoline. It is the responsibility of the driver to fill the fuel tank of the vehicle before returning it to Coastal's transportation office.
- Gasoline charge cards will not be issued with the

rental cars and vans. The driver will be responsible for making gas purchases while renting a vehicle. Receipts for gasoline purchases should be submitted to the Office of Business Affairs for reimbursement.

- The university is required to give Enterprise a 24-hour working day notice of any reservation cancellations. Departments will be charged an additional fee if contractual requirements are not met.
- Rental vehicle fees include unlimited mileage. The rates are as follows:

A limited number of Coastal-owned sedans and vans are being maintained in the motor pool for short-distance travel and/or short-term use only. As in the past, the requesting department will be charged for mileage. Due to increased maintenance costs of the vehicles, it is necessary to increase mileage rates for Coastal vehicles. Mileage rates for Coastal vehicles will be \$.25 per mile for sedans and \$.30 per mile for vans. These vehicles will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis and will be subject to restricted use.

## Panhellenic Council outstanding performance recognized

Coastal Carolina University's Panhellenic Council has been recognized for outstanding academic performance by the National Panhellenic Conference, a national organization of sororities. Coastal's Panhellenic Council will be entered on the Academic Honor Roll of the National Panhellenic Conference.

Four Coastal sororities are members of the conference: Alpha Sigma Alpha, Gamma Phi Beta, Phi Sigma Sigma, and Sigma Sigma Sigma.

Women in Coastal's Panhellenic sororities achieved a higher grade point average than Coastal's women students in general during the 1995-1996 academic year. "As a requirement for membership, all Coastal sorority members must maintain a minimum

grade point average determined by each national sorority organization," said Debbie Conner, Coastal's director of student activities.

"In addition to meeting academic standards, each sorority is required to raise funds each year for a particular philanthropy, such as camps for abused girls, as well as for local chapters of organizations such as the March of Dimes and the American Heart Association," she said. "Coastal sororities are also involved in promoting awareness of women's issues."

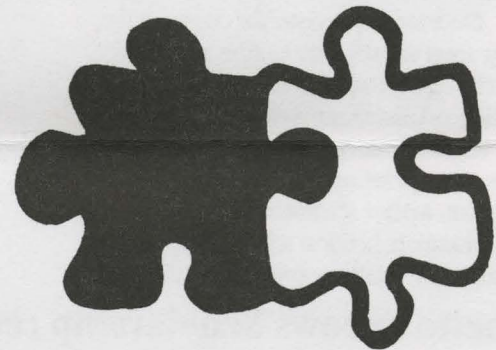
