Advisory Committee awards scholarships

The Georgetown County Advisory Committee of Coastal Carolina University has awarded scholarship monies for the 1996 academic year.

Four Coastal Carolina University students who are employed full time and attend classes at night were awarded a total of \$2,625 in scholarship funds by the committee. The following students received awards:

- Sonya Barrineau of Andrews, sophomore psychology major;
- Leon Jackson of Georgetown, junior psychology major;
- Margie Maybank of Georgetown, senior education major; and
- Karen Powell of Andrews, freshman psychology major.

The committee also has established a \$1,000 scholarship to be awarded annually to a Georgetown

County School System senior who chooses to attend Coastal Carolina University. The 1996 recipient of this award is Robert Hill of Georgetown, a freshman history major. Hill, who graduated in the top 20 percent of his class at Georgetown High School, was a member of the South Carolina Junior Academy of Science and the Young Republican Club while in high school.

In July, the committee also awarded \$6,000 in scholarships to 15 students who completed Coastal's 1996 College Jumpstart program. The awards ranged from \$200 to \$700 per student.

In all a total of \$9,625 in scholarships have been awarded from the annual allotment which the Georgetown County Council provides to the committee to operate Coastal's Georgetown campus. ♦

Coastal sponsors Fall Conference for Educators

Teachers and educators are invited to participate in Coastal's Fall Conference for Educators entitled "The Power of Story: Weaving Literacy Throughout the Curriculum 6-12" scheduled for September 20 and 21 on campus.

Led by Janet Allen and Tom Romano, experts in the field of literacy in middle and secondary schools, the conference will help teachers create successful programs for unsuccessful readers and writers, integrate language arts and social studies, and align curricula within district and state frameworks. Participants in the conference will take part in interactive workshops which address these goals.

Janet Allen teaches English education and is the Writing Project director at the University of Central Florida. She has extensive experience in working with students who are at risk in terms of literacy and currently consults with school districts which apply her approach to reclaim failing readers. She is author of the book *It's Never Too Late: Leading Adolescents to Lifelong Literacy*.

Tom Romano is assistant professor of teacher education at Miami University in Oxford, Ohio. He worked for 17 years as a high school teacher, an experience which inspired his book *Clearing the Way: Working with Teenage Writers*. His latest book, *Writing With Passion: Life Stories, Multiple Genres*, was published in 1995.

Workshop topics include "Reclaiming the Adolescent Non-reader," "Integrating Social Studies and Language Arts," "Writing to Learn in History and Social Studies," "Multi-genre research projects," "Picture Books in Middle and High School," "Inquiry Workshops," "Building Community," "History Through Community," "Portfolio Assessment," and "Literature Discussion Group."

The conference is cosponsored by the Coastal Area Writing Project, the Center for Excellence in Middle

Level Initiative and the Division of Extended Learning and Public Services.

The cost for the conference is \$75. The hours of the conference are 4 to 7 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 20 and 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 21.

Graduate level contract course for educators offered

A graduate level contract course, "If This Is Social Studies Why Isn't It Boring?" for teachers of history, social studies and language arts (grades 1 through 12) will be offered during the fall semester.

The course will involve participants in a history workshop approach which will demonstrate how to weave authentic literacy and inquiry studies into any social studies or history curriculum. Emphasis will be placed on the use of literature and writing to enhance students' understanding of and connection to the content.

The course will be led by Janet Files, director of the Coastal Area Writing Project, and will be held from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on Oct. 12, 26, Nov. 2, 16, and Dec. 17. Course participants also will be required to attend Coastal's Fall Conference for Educators, entitled "The Power of Story: Weaving Literacy Through the Curriculum 6-12," scheduled for Sept. 20 and 21 on Coastal's campus.

The cost of the course is \$150 plus \$75 for the Power of Story Conference.

S.T.A.R. sponsors American Red Cross Blood Drive

S.T.A.R. (Students Taking Active Responsibility) will sponsor an American Red Cross (ARC) Blood Drive on Wednesday, Sept. 25 from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the Student Center, first floor. Donors will receive a Red Cross sports bottle in appreciation for their support.

The blood supply level in Horry County is at a critical low and the area needs blood donors, according to Ellen Varnadore, donor recruitment representative for Horry County. The blood supply was at a critical level for almost two months this past summer. When Hurricane Bertha and Hurricane Fran threatened the coast, area blood drives had to be canceled for two days putting the blood supply again at a critical level.

Coastal Carolina and Charleston Southern have been in friendly competition for two years to determine which university could secure the most blood donations.

In 1995-1996 Charleston Southern retained the trophy presented by the American Red Cross by donating 190 pints of blood during the school year. Coastal Carolina donated 154 pints.

"This is going to be the year for Coastal Carolina," Varnadore said. "We're going to bring home the trophy this year and take it away from the Buccaneers. In order to do that, Coastal Carolina students, faculty and staff have to roll up their sleeves and give the Gift of Life."
