MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR DR. ENGELMAYER

A special memorial service for the late Dr. Reinhold J. Engelmayer has been scheduled for Tuesday, Jan. 26th, in the Coastal Carolina College Student Center.

Engelmayer, 41, an associate professor of anthropology and sociology, died in his sleep Saturday night or Sunday morning while on a railway trip between the Chinese cities of Chaengtu and Chungking.

Dr. Engelmayor, who was known in the Waccamaw region for his excavations of prehistoric Indian sites, was participating in an educational exchange of faculty and students between the University of South Carolina and Shansi University in Taiyuan. He arrived in the People's Republic of China with the University of South Carolina delegation in September and was reportedly on an overnight sightseeing trip with five other members of the university delegation when he died.

"The faculty, administration, and student body at Coastal Carolina College are saddened by Dr. Engelmayer's death," Coastal Carolina College Chancellor Edward M. Singleton said.

"He was a very intelligent man and was very knowledgeable in his field. He will be remembered for his work in uncovering the history of the early residents of the Waccamaw region. He was the first archaeologist to engage in long-term excavation of pre-Columbian Indian sites in our section of South Carolina, and he was also a popular public speaker in the community. His accomplishments will be difficult to duplicate."

A native of Vienna, Austria, Dr. Engelmayor, came to USC-Coastal Carolina College in 1970. He held a Ph.D. from Leopold Franzens University in Austria, and the equivalent of a master's degree from the University of Vienna. Prior to joining the faculty of Coastal Carolina College, he was an instructor in Prehistory at the University of Tuebingen, in West Germany. He was the former assistant director and curator of the Museum of Natural History in Vienna, Austria, and he had also served as a field archaeologist for the United Nations in Egypt.

He conducted archaeological and physical-anthropological research in Central and Eastern Europe, in the Mediterranean, in the Near East, in North Africa, in the U.S., and in Latin America. His research on Chinese archaeology, conducted from September until the time of his death, is scheduled for publication in the People's Republic of China and will probably be published in the United States, according to USC officials.

The public is invited to attend Tuesday's memorial service.

USC-COASTAL CAROLINA OFFERS COURSE IN BLACK POETRY

The development of black poetry will be studied in a new short course offered to the public by the Office of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College. Registration for the course is now under way.

The course, entitled "The Harlem Renaissance: Themes in Black Poetry," will meet in Room 107 of the College Academic Building from 7 - 8:30 p.m., Feb. 1 - Mar.1, college officials have announced.

"This course will trace the development of themes in black poetry during the period of the Harlem Renaissance," explains Dr. Sally Z. Hare, Director of the Office of Continuing Education at the college.

"Special attention will be given to the works of Claude McKay, Countee Cullen, and Langston Hughes. Class sessions will concentrate on extensive analysis and discussion of the poetry of the period."

The instructor for the course is Coastal Carolina College professor Veronica Davis.

CAMPUS SHUTTLE SERVICE AVAILABLE
