COLLEGE ALUMNI TO GATHER

From throughout South Carolina and from other states alumni of USC-Coastal Carolina College will be returning to the college campus between Myrtle Beach and Conway Feb. 5 and 6.

The Coastal Carolina College Alumni Association has planned "Reunion Rally '82" for the weekend at the college.

"This will be a reunion of all Coastal Carolina College Alumni dating back to the class of 1954," explains William H. "Billy" Alford, president of the Coastal Carolina College Alumni Association.

"Reunion Rally '82" will begin with registration at the Student Center at 7:30 p.m., of Friday, Feb. 5, and will include an annual meeting and dinner at 8 p.m. Friday, followed by the alumni bar-b-que lunch, an alumni basketball game, a hospitality period, basketball action by the college men's and women's teams and a post-game reception Saturday night.

"The alumni basketball game, which begins at 2 p.m., Saturday in Kimbel Gymnasium, is the highlight of the alumni activities," says Alumni Association Treasurer Debbie Schmitt, who is Homecoming Committee Chairman.

"We're going to work out the age factor and come up with two teams of alumni basketball players. One team will be coached by former coach Dan Selwa, who is now a professor at the college, and the other team will be coached by former coach Dr. Edward M. Singleton."

COLLEGE FILM CLUB SPONSERS PUBLIC FILM SERIES

The Coastal Cinematic Society of USC-Coastal Carolina College is presenting two spring film series which are open to the public and which will feature classic motion pictures at reduced prices.

Relatively recent films will be shown every second or third Thursday and Friday at 8 p.m. in the college Lecture Hall. Admission to this film series is \$2 per film.

Older, classic motion pictures will be shown on Thursdays at 8 p.m. in the Lecture Hall for an admission price of \$1 per film. A season pass, which will admit film buffs to all motion pictures in both series, is available to faculty and staff for \$10.

Films in the recent film include: "The Burmese Harp," "The Party," "Joan of the Angels," "La Salaire da la Peur," and "Bridge on the River Kwai."

Upcoming films in the classic series include: a W.C. Fields classic, "The Dentist," Charlie Chaplin's "The Great Dictator;" the Greek tragedy "Antigone;" a Rudolph Valentino feature, "Son of the Sjeik," and a 1930 newsreel obituary of Valentino; a D.W. Griffith collection of shorts; a Buster Keaton collection of shorts, "The Tin Drum," and Roman Polanski's "Two Men and a Wardrobe."

COLLEGE HISTORY TOUR TO CONTINUE

The 1982 schedule for the college's popular "Rebels and Redcoats" history tour has been released.

Created by the College Office of Continuing Education last summer, the all-day tour has introduced hundreds of tourists and residents to the colorful history of South Carolina's Waccamaw Region.

The new tour schedule includes Friday tours on Feb. 5th, March 5th, and April 16th. During the summertime, the tour will be operating every Friday, College officials predict.

Travelling by commercial bus, tour participants are guided on an all-day excursion to historical sites in Horry and Georgetown Counties. Among the sites visited on the history tour are: Kingston Presbyterian Church in Conway, the site of the colonial settlement of Kingston Township; Murrell's Inlet, home of ghosts, blockade runners and pirates; Fort White, the huge confederate fort which guarded Georgetown during the Civil War; Hopsewee Plantation, the home of a signer of the Declaration of Independence; Prince George Winyah Episcopal Church, one of the oldest churches in the nation; Friendship Village, a rare remaining slave village; and Hobcaw Barony, the winter retreat where Wall Street financier Bernard Baruch entertained such famous guests as President Franklin D. Roosevelt and British Prime Minister Winston Churchill.

The tour leaves Wheelwright Auditorium at 9:30 a.m. and returns to the college at 5 p.m. Tuition for the allday tour is \$25 for adults and \$20 for children. The fee includes a pre-trip breakfast of doughnuts and juice, afternoon snacks, transportation to all sites, guided tours and admission to several historic sites normally available at the Belle Isle Yacht Club for \$4.95.
