HISTORY DAY TO BE HELD AT COASTAL

Students from throughout South Carolina's Sixth Congressional District are being invited to perform, read papers and display multimedia and tabletop exhibits in the National History Day competition scheduled for Saturday, March 27th, at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

National History Day began in 1974 as a county-wide competition in Ohio and has blossomed into a national celebration and competition, which last year attracted more than 40,000 participants in 29 states.

"National History Day is being coordinated by the History Department of USC-Coastal Carolina College in the Sixth District," explains history professor Dr. Joseph Wightman of the college faculty.

"After the district-wide competition is held at Coastal Carolina College on March 27th, winners will compete in the state contest at Lander College in Greenwood on Saturday, April 24th," Wightman says.

"The winners of the state contest will compete in the national contest at College Park, Maryland in June."

Students from grades six through twelve are eligible to participate. Student papers, projects and performances are judged in junior and senior divisions by history professionals.

"Participation in National History Day helps young people understand American and world history so that they gain perspective on events and an appreciation for their way of life," says Wightman. "The program aims to place the study of history firmly into the school curriculum in order to provide well-rounded, informed citizens who will be prepared to vote intelligently. Well-researched papers, projects and performances stimulate imagination and creativity as well as reading and writing skills."

Teachers informed of the program through poster-brochures and other communications. The teachers then encourage their students to study a topic and prepare an entry as an out-of-classroom endeavor, or they can incorporate the annual theme into their curriculum and have all students participate as a classroom assignment. Teachers of winning students are recognized and commended during the contest award ceremonies.

"STREETCAR" TO OPEN AT WHEELWRIGHT AUDITORIUM

"A Streetcar Named Desire," the Pulitzer Prize winning play by Tennessee Williams, will open in Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College Friday, February 26, for a three-day run, college officials have announced.

The play, produced by the school's Coastal Carolina Theatre, will hold performances at 8 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 26th; Saturday, Feb. 27th; and on Monday, March 1st. Tickets at the door will be \$3.50 and season tickets will be applicable. The production will be directed by Tom Jones, the director of the Speech and Theatre Department at the college.

Playwright Tennessee Williams took the title of this play from the name of a streetcar which one ran through the old French Quarter of New Orleans and connected with another car named Cemetery. The play tells the story of frail and fading Blanche, who arrives suddenly at the home of her young sister, Stella, and Stella's boisterous husband, Stanley Kowalski. Her arrival brings clashes and confusion. Her gentle flurry of petty and futile pretences and her talk about her nerves, her former job and lost Southern plantations soon cause conflict in the household. Through the hot summer days the tension grows until the pressure erupts in a memorable climax.

Tickets for the play are now on sale at Wheelwright Auditorium. Box office hours are 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.

Director Tom Jones says the cast of the upcoming production will soon be publicly announced.

FREE ARTISTS WORKSHOP AT USC-COASTAL

A free workshop for artists is scheduled at USC-Coastal Carolina College on Wed. Feb. 10th, and will be directed by professional artist James Herman. A recognized expert in the manufacture and usage of art materials, Herman is a popular lecturer. He has taught art and art history at the University of Oregon and Missouri Western College. His work is in the permanent collection of the Bank of America, and his credits include exhibitions in Venice, Rome, and Washington, D.C.

The workshop will be held in room 003 of the Fine Arts Building at USC-Coastal Carolina College, 10a.m. - noon. The public is invited.

Herman will describe both standard and esoteric properties of oil, acrylic, and watercolor. He will discuss

supports such as canvas, paper and various types of board, and he will comment on mediums, varnishes, brushes, palettes and painting knives. The program is designed to teach the student artist how to properly select from the wide range of available supplies in the market place, and what this specifically means to each in terms of his or her own advancement in style. Questions will be encouraged.

The free workshop is sponsored by the college Art Department.
