SERVICE HELD FOR HOWARD BROWN

Funeral services were held in Johnsonville, S.C., Friday for Howard Lee Brown, the 21 year-old USC-Coastal Carolina College basketball player who died in Myrtle Beach of cardiac arrest.

A junior at Coastal Carolina College, Brown collapsed in his room at a Myrtle Beach motel, where he and other basketball players lived under the college's off-campus housing program. He received emergency treatment from his roommates, professional paramedics and hospital emergency personnel, but he failed to respond to treatment and was declared dead at Grand Strand General Hospital at 11:19 Sunday night, Feb. 7.

"We think an underlying heart problem triggered this, but we don't know exactly what caused it," said Dr. Charles Mackey, the Myrtle Beach physician who treated the student at the hospital. "He had no history of cardiac problems," Mackey said, "and he appeared in excellent shape."

Brown, a sociology major at Coastal Carolina College, transferred to the college last fall from Spartanburg Methodist College, where he had played basketball for two years. He was the son of Mr. and Mrs. R.J. Brown of Johnsonville. The family says donations to a Howard Brown Memorial Fund at Coastal Carolina College may be made in lieu of flowers, and should be directed to the Coastal Educational Foundation.

FRATERNITY BLOOD DRIVE

The APO fraternity at USC-Coastal Carolina College, in conjunction with the Lowcountry Chapter of the American Red Cross, will sponsor a blood drive at the college.

"This is the fifth year in which the APO has sponsored a blood drive on campus," says APO advisor Steve Nagle, "The APO is the largest service fraternity in the country and each APO chapter is dedicated to serving the college and the community."

Nagle says APO hopes to raise 75 pints of blood for the American Red Cross through the blood drive.

The blood drive will be held in the college center card room and the overflow dining room on Tuesday, Feb. 16th, from 10 a.m. - 3 p.m.

"STREETCAR" TO OPEN AT WHEELWRIGHT AUDITORIUM

"A Streetcar Named Desire," the Pulitzer Prize winning play by Tennessee Williams, will open in Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College Friday, February 26, for a three-day run.

The play, produced by the school's Coastal Carolina Theatre, will hold performances at 8 p.m. on Friday, Feb. 26th; Saturday, Feb. 27th; and on Monday, March 1st. Tickets at the door will be \$3.50 and season tickets will be applicable. The production will be directed by Tom Jones, the director of the Speech and Theatre Department at the college.

Playwright Tennessee Williams took the title of this play from the name of a streetcar which one ran through the old French Quarter of New Orleans and connected with another car named Cemetery. The play tells the story of frail and fading Blanche, who arrives suddenly at the home of her young sister, Stella, and Stella's boisterous husband, Stanley Kowalski. Her arrival brings clashes and confusion. Her gentle flurry of petty and futile pretences and her talk about her nerves, her former job and lost Southern plantations soon cause conflict in the household. Through the hot summer days the tension grows until the pressure erupts in a memorable climax.

Tickets for the play are now on sale at Wheelwright Auditorium. Box office hours are 9 a.m. - 5 p.m.

TENNIS CLASSES OFFERED

The Office of Continuing Education at Coastal Carolina College is sponsoring a special series of short-courses in tennis instruction for children and adults, beginning Feb. 16, college officials have announced.

Registration for the program is now underway.

A junior tennis program, for players, ages 8-14, begins Feb. 20, and meets 10-11 a.m., Saturdays, for five weeks through March 20th. The class meets at Myrtle Beach Racquet club, includes instruction by tennis pro Ralph Tessier, and costs \$40 for five lessons.

A beginning tennis program begins Thursday, Feb. 18 and meets every Thursday, 10-11 a.m., for five weeks at the Myrtle Beach Racquet Club, Feb. 18-March 18. The beginning tennis class will teach the basics of tennis to players with little or no background in the game. Tuition is \$40 for five sessions.

Tennis instruction for intermediate players, who know the basics, will begin Tuesday, Feb. 16, at the same location, and will continue weekly through March 16, with five sessions held each Tuesday, 10-11 a.m. Videotape analysis and court discounts will be featured. Tuition is \$40. Advanced Tennis, for the experienced player, will meet Thursdays.

Sherri Estridge, a 19-year-old sophomore, was crowned Coastal Carolina's Homecoming Queen 1982 Saturday at halftime of the men's game with the Erskine Flying Fleet.
