SPRING ARTS FESTIVAL UNVEILED THIS WEEK

Performing artists from all nine University of South Carolina campuses will assemble this week at USC-Coastal Carolina College for the 1982 USC Spring Arts Festival.

Spring Arts Festival '82, scheduled for March 31-April 2, will feature more than 50 performers. The festival begins at 8 p.m., Wednesday, March 31 with an opening night performance in Wheelwright Auditorium by Carolina Camerate Woodwind Quintet, a highly-regarded quintet of performers from USC-Columbia.

The Spring Arts Festival continues all day Thursday and Friday, April 1 and 2, on the Coastal Carolina College campus.

In addition to musical events, the festival will include art exhibits, theatrical productions, a film festival, a puppet show, an international tavern, craft workshops, readings an April Fool's Day parade, and a fun run.

Faculty, staff and students are encouraged to participate in the festival.

FRANK HOLDER PERFORMS MONDAY NIGHT

The Frank Holder Dance Company will perform at USC-Coastal Carolina College at 8 p.m., Monday on March 29th in Wheelwright Auditorium. The performance is part of the 1982 Cultural Arts Series at USC-Coastal Carolina College. Tickets are \$3:00 at the door.

The Frank Holder Dance Company is a company that combines many forms of artistic expression, blends than with a craftsmen's emphasis on costumes, sets, and lighting, and ends up with a creation that communicates moods through visual splendors.

Formed in 1973 by dancer and choreographer Frank Holder, the performers consist of seven dancers and a percussionist who provides live and often improvised accompaniment.

NEW CREDIT UNION PROGRAM

The faculty Welfare and Development Committee would like to announce the benefits of the MBAFB Federal Credit Union MasterCard program. It features a 17.04 annual percentage rate of interest and a 25-day grace period that allows you to pay off the entire balance of purchases without incurring any finance charge. And you pay no annual fee to use your card.

The statement closing date will fall between the 28th and the 5th of the month. Payments must be mailed to Tampa, FL. The minimum requirements for having a MasterCard are:

1. Membership in the credit union
2. An active Share Draft account, or
3. An average savings balance of not less than \$100

If you already have a MasterCard they will convert your present card to your credit union so you can benefit from the additional advantages available to you. You will need to present a statement from your previous MasterCard account so that the transfer can be made. If you do not a card, stop by their Myrtle Beach or Conway office to fill out an application.
