SEASONED CAST TO STAR AT WHEELWRIGHT OPERA

David Bender and Claudia Cummings will sing the leading roles in North Carolina Opera's upcoming performance of DIE FLEDERMAUS at 8 p.m. on Tuesday, April 27 in Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College. They will be joined by four other lead signers: Michael Myers as Alfred, Christine Flasch as Adele, Brad Liebl as Dr. Falke and David Rae Smith as Prince Orlofsky. Two of Charlotte Opera's resident artists will perform: Harold McIntosh as Frank and Stephen Hamilton as Dr. Blind.

The N. C. Opera will be accompanied by the Charlotte Symphony Orchestra and a 16-voice chorus. Tickets are \$10 and are now available at Wheelwright Auditorium.

The April 27 performance of DIE FLEDERMAUS by the Charlotte Opera is presented in recognition of the donors who supported the construction of the new \$3 million Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College. "The recent nine-campus Spring Arts Festival held on USC-Coastal Carolina College campus was an enormous success, reports Dr. Carol Schramm chairman of the event. "It began the evening of Wednesday, March 31, in Wheelwright Auditorium with opening remarks by Dr. Singleton, a concert by the USC-Columbia Carolina Camerate Woodwind Quintet, and a reception. On April 1 and 2, there were fifty events in music, art, theatre, a dance, puppetry, film, literature, and entertainment, concluding with a fun run. The festival received excellent media coverage, with numerous newspaper articles, and photos, radio and TV announcements, a billboard, and several marquees. Many Horry County school children attended."

SINGLETON APPOINTED TO TASK FORCE

USC Coastal Carolina Chancellor Edward Singleton has been appointed to an 18-member task force formed by U.S. Rep. John Napier to promote private sector programs.

Other local members are North Myrtle Beach Times publisher Polly Lowman, Steelworkers Union president John Vereen, Dr. William Fairey of Georgetown and banker Jimmy Clarkson of Loris. Laxton Hinson of Florence will serve as chairman.

The group will work to promote the charitable giving and volunteering of goods and services by private citizens and businesses, Napier said.

"In the future, we will see a growing need for a stronger participation of non government groups to pitch in and sustain many vital human services," the 6st District Republican said in the newsletter.

He said government has proven to be an obstacle for formation and maintenance of private sectors in the past. The members of the task force, among them representatives of government, will work to discover and remove regulatory obstacles, to promote efforts of private programs and to encourage public and private partnerships.

CAROLINAS EDUCATORS TO ATTEND COASTAL WORKSHOP

Educators from North and South Carolina came to the Grand Strand area this past weekend to attend Classroom 80's, a workshop for educators and interested members of the public sponsored by the School of Teacher Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

The Workshop, which is designed to help teachers and educational administrators exchange ideas and update skills, was held Friday and Saturday in Myrtle Beach.

Keynote speakers at the workshop were: Dr. Charles Galloway, an expert on "body language" and other forms of non-verbal communications; Russell Lee French, an author of numerous publications on education oriented communications; and Martha Jean Heggins, an expert in early childhood education.

"PLAZA SUITE"

One of the most mirth-provoking laugh-hits of American stage history, Neil Simon's "Plaza Suite," will begin a series of three performances in Wheelwright Auditorium at Coastal Carolina College on April 23. The play, produced by the Coastal Carolina Theatre of Coastal Carolina College, is scheduled for 8 p.m., Friday, Saturday and Sunday, April 23, 24 and 26. Tickets are \$3 at the door and are now on sale at Wheelwright Auditorium.

"Plaza Suite" is the three-sided comedy by Neil Simon, who offered seven plays and three musicals on Broadway -- ten attractions in all -- within ten years and scored a home run each time he came to bat, an unprecedented record. In succession one suite there is occupied by different registrants who are all in a hilarious predicament of one kind or another. In the first of the plays, a suburban couple came to the Plaza to celebrate their 22nd wedding anniversary in the same suite where they had spent their honeymoon and find that the occasion is fraught with some disillusionments that are curt but funny.

In the second of the triptych of plays, the occupant of the suite is a Hollywood movie producer who, on a quick trip to New York, has summoned to his parlor a housewife from the suburbs who had been his high-school-days sweetheart.

In the third of the playlets involves the parents of a bride, whose wedding party is waiting impatiently in the ballroom fifteen stories below. They are driven to distraction by their daughter--having suddenly panicked minutes before marching to the altar. She has locked herself in the bathroom of the suite after donning her wedding dress and refuses all pleas and stratagems to pry her out.

"Plaza Suite" is the final performance of the season by the Coastal Carolina Theatre, which has been successfully organized by Coastal Carolina College Professor Tom Jones.

PARKING AND SAFETY COMMITTEE REPORTS

The Chancellor's Committee on Parking and Public Safety is pleased to announce that a committee has been appointed to consider appeals on parking tickets. The Appeals Committee will consist of three representatives: one from the faculty, one from the staff and one from the Student Body.

The members of this are: Dr. Donald Millus, Ms. Edna Bellamy and Mr. Robert McCray.

The procedure for responding to parking tickets is as follows:

- 1) Within 72 hours of the receipt of a ticket, report to the Business Office to either pay the fine or initiate an appeal. In order to appeal, paperwork must be initiated within this time.
- 2) In order to appeal, pick up an appeal form from the Business Office and fill it out. There will be two options: one is to request an opportunity to appear before the Appeals Committee and personally plead the case; the other is to completely describe the appeal, in writing, on the form. When completed, submit it to the business office. All appeal forms will be numbered in sequential order of receipt and considered in that order. It will be the responsibility of the Business Office to screen all appeals and recommend initial action to be taken. The chairman of the Appeals Committee will pick up all appeals at the Business Office.

The appeals Committee will hold public hearings in Room 201 of the Student Center, on the first and third Mondays of each month, during the activities hour (1:30 to 2:30 p.m.).

It is the responsibility of the person making the appeal to be present at that meeting.

If a personal appearance is requested and the requestor does not show, then the appeal will be denied. Written appeals will be considered by the committee in private in a timely manner and results will be returned by the chairman to the Business Office. The Business Office will notify appellant of all decisions of the Appeals Committee.
