COASTAL GRADUATES LARGEST CLASS IN HISTORY

USC-Coastal Carolina College has graduated the largest class in the 28-year history of the institution. Two-hundred-twenty-eight students received degrees at the college during the 1981-82 academic year and 155 of the graduates attended commencement at the college Saturday, May 1st to receive their dimplomas.

Former S.C. Governor and U.S. Senator Donald Russell addressed the graduates, citing "a real spirit of leadership in the people of this community, exemplified in the fine institution you have here today and the tremendous progress you have made."

Russell, who is now a U.S. Circuit Court judge, was a high-ranking member of the administration of the late President Franklin D. Roosevelt and he was an Assistant Secretary of State under the late James Byrnes of South Carolina during the Truman administration. Byrnes, who was described as the "Assistant President" during World War II, negotiated with the Soviet Union during treaty talks at Yalta at the end of the war and shortly afterwards picked Russell, a former law partner from Spartanburg, to serve in the State Department.

Dr. Edward M. Singleton, Chancellor of USC-Coastal Carotina College and USC President Dr. James Holderman canounced at Saturday's commencement that a new scholarship was being established at Coastal in honor of Judge Russell. The first recipient of the Russell Scholarship at the college, they announced, is Katherine "Katy" Mason of Myrtle Beach, a senior at the college.

The University of South Carolina, through Coastal Carolina College, also awarded an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters degree to Mr. Eldred Prince of Loris, one of the founders of Coastal Carolina College in 1954.

Mr. Prince was recognized for his lifetime activity in community service. As chairman of the Horry District of Boy Scouts in America, he was responsible for all scouting activity in the county and earned the prestigious silver beaver award in recognition of his service. In 1959, he was appointed to the Horry County Higher Education Commission and served as a member of the Coastal Educational Foundation, the private support body of USC-Coastal Carolina College. In 1978, he received a special citation from USC for outstanding service to Coastal Carolina College.

FAULTY-STAFF ACTIVITIES

Dr. Lance Bedwell was recently elected treasurer of the South Carolina Association of colleges for Teacher Training. The organization consists of 24 of the colleges in South Carolina that are involved in preparing teachers. Professors Wood and Bedwell, along with the Dean of the School of Teacher Education, serve as representatives of Coastal's Teacher Education Program.

Vice Chancellor Roy Talbert was selected to serve as moderator-commentator at a session of the recent Great Lakes History Conference in Grand Rapids Michigan. Dr. Talbert's Session is entitled "The Black Man in a Lumber Boom Town: Saginaw, 1860-1900."

Dr. Charles Joyner, Director of the Waccamaw Regional Studies Project, helped organize and direct a consortium on the South Carolina environment, economy and culture for the S.C. Sea Grant Consortium scheduled for the College of Charleston on May 14.
