

#### COASTAL NAMES NEW ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

The head basketball coach at USC-Coastal Carolina College, Russ Bergman, has been named Athletic Director of the College, Chancellor Edward M. Singleton has announced.

Bergman, who will begin his eighth year as head coach of Coastal's Fighting Chanticleers basketball squad next year, will be responsible for the direction of the athletic program at the college, which has consistently placed teams in regional and national NAIA competition.

Bergman, 34, is a native of Illinois who holds a bachelor's degree from Louisiana State University and a master's degree from Eastern Illinois University. A former infantry captain in the U.S. Army, he came to USC-Coastal Carolina College on 1975, and has taken Coastal's Chanticleers to the playoffs in five of his seven seasons. He begins his position as athletic director at the school while serving as chairman of the basketball committee for NAIA District VI.

He played basketball and baseball at LSU and while earning his graduate degree, he played professional basketball for the Decatur Bullets in the Continental Basketball Association.

"It's a real challange for me to continue the success of the athletic program at Coastal Carolina College," he says. "I want to continue the achievements of Coastal's athletics, while seeking to improve the athletic program wherever possible."

"I believe the future of athletics at Coastal Carolina College is bright because I believe that support for the athletic program will continue to grow," he says.

"Our primary support group is called the CINO Booster Club. 'CINO' is an abbreviation for 'Coastal is number one.' We've had number-one, first-class teams at Coastal and I believe the community here wants a first class, number-one athletic program. To produce the quality athletic program the community wants and the college needs, we're going to have to continue to increase support for athletics. "So we'll be concentrating on expanding the support for Coastal's athletic program. The members of the CINO Booster Club have demonstrated their enthusiasm for first-class collegiate athletics and we'll be seeking more people to be more active in the booster club. A successful program depends on enthusiastic support."

Bergman succeeds former Athletic Director Walt Hambrick, who retired recently from the post to serve on the college faculty.

## MATH WINNERS ANNOUNCED AT COASTAL

Winners of the fourth annual Mathematics Competition at Coastal Carolina College have been named by the Mathematics Advancement Council.

The contest, in which some 200 students from 19 high schools in seven counties participated, is sponsored annually by the School of Mathematics and Computer Services at USC-Coastal Carolina College, the School of Teacher Education at the college and the Horry Georgetown Mathematics Advancement Council.

The students competed on two levels: level I consisted of students who have taken Algebra II and level II consisted of students who have taken courses below Algebra II.

Simon Gielstra of Myrtle Beach High School won first place in level II competition. Second place went to Nelson White of Socastee High School and third place was taken by Brenda Johnson of Wilson High School.

Mark Schoen of Aynor High School won first place in the level I competition. Second place went to Nancy Humphries of Coastal Academy and Anne Marie Hanna of Johnsonville High School finished third.

Coastal Carolina College mathematics professor Stephen West is the director of the contest.

### **TAX SUGGESTION OFFERED**

Coastal Carolina's Professor Lou Gilles supplied this commentary on tax refunds, which he extracted from Accounting for Business Decisions.

"The deceptive lure of a tax refund check. The majority of Americans receive tax refunds each year. Apparently these 60 million or more persons so enjoy receiving a refund check that they are willing to have the government withhold excessive amounts of tax from their paychecks throughout the year. The IRS reports that millions of individual taxpayers declare fewer personal exemptions than they expect to claim at year-end. The result is over-withholding of billions of dollars on which the government pays no interest. It seems strange during a period of inflation and high interest rates that American taxpayers would choose to have the government hold their money throughout the year with no interest on order to be paid back at yearend in dollars worth less in purchasing power than when earned."

Gilles says taxpayers can now claim up to 14 payroll exemptions without the employer being required to notify the IRS.
