FISHING TOURNAMENT ON SEPT. 22

The Ninth Annual Coastal Carolina Invitational, an intercollegiate fishing match and seminar sponsored by USC-Coastal Carolina College is scheduled for September 22-24 this year, college officials have announced.

Six teams from U. S. and Canada will compete in the intercollegiate tournament this fall, according to Don Millus, who organized the nine-year old event. Millus is also the coach of the Coastal Carolina College team.

This year student fishermen from Yale University, Princeton University, Western Ontario University, Coastal Carolina College and two more South Carolina schools will compete in the tag-and-release deep-sea fishing competition held out of Murrells Inlet. Evening seminars on sportfishing and conservation are scheduled as part of the tournament at Springmaid Beach, the Leroy Springs Company complex in Myrtle Beach. The public is welcome and admission is free.

The Invitational is the only intercollegiate match and seminar in the U.S. at present, but it's part of a tradition began in Nova Scotia, Canada, some thirty years ago. The original intercollegiate matches featured Ivy League and Canadian universities fishing for cod and tuna.

The South Carolina version of intercollegiate fishing combined with education was started just before the Canadian event fell victim to Nova Scotia politics and budget cuts. Despite being dependent on the local economy (no state funds are provided), the Coastal Carolina Invitational has survived for almost a decade.

A North-South competition was added last year with the South, led by Francis Marion College's first place finish, winning by a very few pounds. Yale University finished second overall, with host school Coastal Carolina College turning in its poorest showing ever for fifth place. The University of North Carolina at Wilmington had won the event in 1980.

Dr. Richard Moore will be the featured speaker at the evening seminar on Wednesday, September 22nd at 8 p.m., and George Reiger of *Field and Stream*, Charles Moore of the South Carolina Wildlife and Marine Resource Department, and W. W. "Creekman" Hills, a noted Charleston angler, will among the speakers at

the Thursday, September 23rd, program at 8 p.m. on the future of salt water sportfishing.

Student anglers and coaches will fish out of Murrells Inlet on Thursday, September 23rd, on board Captain Tommy Sing's "Flying Fisher" and on Friday, September 24th on Captain Bill Moeller's "Capt. Bill." Fish caught but not tagged and released the first day will be filleted and donated to the Horry County Shelter Home. The catch from the second day will be sold to benefit the Murrells Inlet Rescue Squad.

Principal sponsors of the Coastal Carolina Invitational include Coastal Carolina College, the Leroy Springs Company and Springmaid Beach, Skyway Golf Club in Myrtle Beach, and the Waccamaw Chapter of the South Carolina Wildlife Federation. Donations from Horry County businesses account for most of the financial support of the Invitational.

Mitch Godwin of Conway National Bank is in charge of fundraising for the Invitational, assisted by Dr. Richard Koesterer of the Science Department at Coastal Carolina College. The Invitational director and founder is Donald Millus a member of the Humanities faculty at Coastal Carolina College in Conway.

ALUMNI/FACULTY SOFTBALL GAME ON SEPT. 16

The Fifth annual faculty-Alumni Softball Game will be held at 4 p.m., Thursday, Sept. 16th at the college softball field. Chancellor Edward M. Singleton will be the faculty coach and Randy Alford, an alumnus of the college, will coach the alumni team.

Two of the four games have been won by the faculty and two have been won by the alumni team, so this year's game will be a tie breaker.

"Last year the alumni really clobbered the faculty and we won the trophy," says Debbie Schmidt, vice president of the Alumni Association. "This year we're going to do it again and we plan to keep the trophy."

Faculty and staff members who are interested in playing the game should contact Dr. Singleton. The rain date for the game is Sept. 23. Admission to the game is free and refreshments will be provided.

NATIONAL TEACHER'S EXAM HELD AT CCC

The National Teacher's Examination (NTE) will be offered four times during the coming academic year according to Educational Testing Service, which administers the program.

The new NTE Core Battery, which tests communication skills, general knowledge, and professional knowledge, and which replaces the Common Examinations, will be administered on November 13 and March 5. Specialty Area Tests for students completing teacher preparation programs and for advanced degree candidates in five fields - audiology, guidance counseling, media specialist, reading specialist, and speech pathology - will be given on October 30 and April 30. The Core Battery and a Specialty Area Test cannot be taken on the same day.

NTE scores are used by many large school districts as one of several factors in the selection of new teachers. Some colleges require these examinations of all students preparing to teach, and several states use the tests for certification and licensing.

All of the examinations will be offered at test centers throughout the country. Tests will be held at USC Coastal Carolina College on Oct. 30 and April 30.

Prospective registrants should contact the school districts in which they seek employment, state agencies through which they seek certification or licensing, their colleges, or the appropriate educational association for advice about which NTE tests to take.

The NTE Bulletin of Information contains a list of test centers, general information about the NTE program, and a registration form, copies may be obtained from college placements officers, school personnel departments, or directly from NTE. ART LINKLETTER TO SPEAK HERE

Television and radio star Art Linkletter will deliver a free public address at USC-Coastal Carolina College at 8 p.m. on Oct 19, college officials have announced.

Linkletter, a popular, nationally-known public speaker made famous by his network television program called *People are Funny*, is speaking at Coastal Carolina College as part of the William A. Kimbel Community Enrichment Series, sponsored by the Kimbel Trust and *The Sun News*.

The William A. Kimbel Community Enrichment Series was established last year by the Kimbel Trust to provide speakers of national reputation for the community in honor of the late William A. Kimbel of Murrells Inlet, who was a major supporter of Coastal Carolina College and an influential booster of South Carolina's Grand Strand region.

The Kimbel Trust sponsors two nationally recognized speakers at USC-Coastal Carolina College each academic year and is joined this year by *The Sun News*, which is co-sponsoring this year's series.

Linkletter will deliver his Oct. 19 address in Wheelwright Auditorium. The public is invited.

A television and radio performer for more than 45 years, Art Linkletter has started in two of the longest-running programs in broadcast history: *House Party*, which aired on CBS radio and television for 25 years, and *People Are Funny*, which aired on NBC television and radio for 19 years. Linkletter won an Emmy Award for *House Party* and he has performed in numerous television specials and motion pictures.

He is the author of 16 books, including *Kids Say the Darndest Things*, which was a national best-seller.
