NEW NURSING DEAN APPOINTED AT COASTAL CAROLINA

Dr. Milene A. Megel has been appointed Dean of the School of Nursing at USC-Coastal Carolina College, Dr. Edward M. Singleton, Chancellor of the college, has announced. Dr. Megel, a native of Superior, Wisconsin, comes to Coastal Carolina College from a position as Associate Professor and Director of the Nursing Administration Graduate Program at the University of South Carolina's Columbia campus.

She served as Acting Dean of the College of Nursing at USC before accepting her new post at Coastal Carolina. She holds a Ph. D. in Educational Administration from the University of Iowa, a Masters degree in Medical-Surgical Nursing from the same institution and a Bachelor of Nursing degree from the College of St. Scholastica in Duluth Minnesota.

Prior to moving to South Carolina, Dr. Megel was Educational Director of Moline Hospital School of Nursing in Moline, Illinois for nine years. She now serves as a nursing consultant to the William Jennings Bryan Veterans Hospital in Columbia and to the S.C. American Hospital Association. She has conducted numerous workshops on nursing leadership and management throughout the state and she has served as an accreditation team member for the National Leagure for Nursing.

She succeeds Jean Layton Roberts, who retired from the college during the summer after a distinguished tenure as director of the nursing program.

HUNTING & FISHING DAY AT COASTAL SEPT. 25

Conway, SC -- Conway's Fourth Annual National Hunting and Fishing Day will be held September 25 at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

The activites will be co-sponsored by the Conway Chamber of Commerce and the Waccamaw Chapter of the South Carolina Wildlife Federation. The purpose of observing National Hunting and Fishing Day is to recognize the nation's sportsmen for their contributions to wildlife conservation. Planned activities for the day include hunting & boating safety programs, wild game cooking contest, a turtle race, a casting activity, a snake show, an alligator display, a master falconer, deer and bear education, archery demonstrations, and a black power rifle demonstration.

Many arts and crafts exhibitors will also be at the celebration, such as wood carvers, artists, taxidermists, leather craftsmen, Catawba Indian Potterers, a stained glass artist, basket weavers, knife makers. duck decoy carvers, chair caners, net and hammock makers and much more. Many items will be available for sale.

DOLL-MAKING AND NUTRITION COURSES NOW OPEN

If you've always wanted to be one of those talented, clever people who make their Christmas presents, you may be able to get some help from a non-credit crafts class now taking registration at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

The course is called "Adopt-A-Doll" and it's designed to teach participants how to make the popular soft-sculptured dolls similiar to Xavier Roberts' "Little People" dolls. The class, which will meet on Tuesday nights from 7:30-9:30, Oct. 5-26, is taught by Penny Danielson, an experienced doll-maker whose littlepeople-type dolls are popular items in many area gift shops and craft stores.

Registration for the course is now open through the Office of Continuing Education and will remain open until filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Tuition for the instructional course is \$35 and includes all materials needed to make a doll. (Faculty and staff receive discounts.)

Section II of the crafts class is offered from 7:30-9:30 on Monday nights, Nov. 8-29. Registration can be made by telephone by calling the Office of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College at 448-1481 or 347-3161. The doll-making class will meet at Coastal Carolina College.

The Continuing Education Office at the college is also offering a special three-session course entitled "Nutrition and Physical Fitness and Its Impact in Total Health." This workshop, which will meet Tuesdays 7-9 p.m., Sept. 28-Oct. 12, is designed to help participants understand how nutrition and exercise affect total health. They will learn how the energy nutrients affect the body and how a balance between diet and exercise can be achieved. The fee for the course is \$30.

Another nutrition course, "Nutrition and Exercise for Today's Lifestyle," is scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 4, 7-9 p.m. at Coastal Carolina College for tuition of \$7. The course will present facts and fallacies concerning basic nutrition concepts. Fad diets will be reviewed and alternative methods of exercise will be discussed. Students will learn how to determine their own caloric needs in relationship to weight and activity.

"Nutrition After 50" is a course designed for those interested in diet and nutritional needs after the age of 50. It will focus on needs, eating habits and lifestyles relevant to people 50 and older. Participants will learn how to calculate caloric needs and how to design a diet to suit their age and lifestyle. It will meet Monday, Oct. 11, 2-4 p.m. at the North Myrtle Beach Recreation Center and on Tuesday, Oct. 26, 2-4 p.m. at USC-Coastal Carolina College. Tuition for each class is \$7. Registration is now open and may be made by calling the Office of Continuing Education.
