## LINKLETTER SPEAKS TUESDAY NIGHT

Art Linkletter is famous today as a television star, author and motivational speaker, but he began his professional life as a hobo—riding the rails from California to New York.

The year was 1929 and Linkletter, like many young American men of that era, set out to find his fortune. Lacking transportation money, he and a friend hitched rides on railway freight cars across the country. He worked at various jobs in various places, then took to the rails again, sharing boxcars with hoboes of all ages. Once he was robbed at gunpoint by two other hoboes who finally ran away after arguing whether they should kill their young victim. Near Minneapolis he narrowly escaped harm when a bomb exploded in a notorious nightclub where he bussed tables. He risked suffocation in a refrigerator car and almost rolled off a train to his death while sleeping atop a freight car one night.

Young Art Linkletter finally arrived in New York and landed a reputable job as a typist on Wall Street—just in time for the 1929 Wall Street Stockmarket Crash. From Wall Street he wound up on a slow-moving freighter, facing perils as a back hand and night watch on a cruise to South America. He finally wandered back home to California, entered college at San Diego State and was eventually hired as a part-time announcer at a local radio station. From local radio announcer he rose to network radio and television, becoming one of America's most beloved entertainers.

Art Linkletter will draw from his colorful past and humorous adventures when he presents a motivational speech entitled "Yes! You Can!" in Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College on Tuesday night, October 19 at 8 p.m. His address is free to the public and is part of the 1982-83 William A. Kimbel Distinguished Lecture Series, sponsored by the Kimbel Trust, the Episcopal Diocese of S.C., the Sun News and Coastal Carolina College.

Art Linkletter was born in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan, Canada. His mother gave him up for adoption and he became the son of Reverend Fulton Linkletter and his wife, who moved to Lowell, Mass. and later to San Diego. By the time Linkletter finished San Diego State, after his wanderings as a deck hand and hobo, he was established as a radio announcer and entertainer.

Eventually, he became nationally famous as the host of the CBS radio program "House Party" and the NBC radio program "People are Funny." He continued to host the programs on network television and became one of America's best known television personalities. He is the author of 16 books, including Kids Say The Darndest Things!, which was the number one national best seller for two years.

He is an active motivational speaker, delivering addresses throughout the nation and he is a leader in the movement against illegal drug use.

The public is invited to attend his speech at Wheelwright Auditorium on Oct. 19th.
