COASTAL TO DEDICATE \$2 MILLION SCIENCE BUILDING OCT. 26

A high-ranking member of the U.S. Department of Energy from Washington will deliver a speech on energy to officially dedicate the Coastal's new, \$2.1 million science building in a ceremony at 11 a.m., Tuesday, October 26 on the Coastal campus.

The ceremony will be held in front of the new, 35,000 square-foot structure. The new building contains 12 teaching laboratories, eight classrooms, 23 faculty offices, research facilities, a darkroom, an electron microscope room, an instrument room and supply facilities.

The keynote speaker at the dedication ceremony will be Dr. Richard H. Kropschot, the Associate Director for Basic Energy Sciences in the Office of Energy Research at the Department of Energy in Washington. Kropschot is responsible for planning and coordinating the overall content and future direction of the various basic energy sciences programs, which include research in the physical and biological sciences, applied mathematics and engineering.

Before he joined the Department of Energy, he was with the National Bureau of Standards, conducting research in the Cryogenic Engineering and Low Temperature Physics Program in Boulder, Colorado. His work earned him the Department of Commerce Gold Medal.

Kropschot holds a Ph. D. in physics, a master's degree and a bachelor's degree from Michigan State University. He is a professor adjunct in the department of chemical engineering at the University of Colorado and he has taught at the University of California in Los Angeles. He served for a year with the U.S. Energy Research and Development Administration as a Department of Science Fellow. He also served on a panel studying the Apollo-13 spacecraft and serves as editor of an industry magazine, *Review of Scientific Instruments and Cryogenics*.

Faculty, staff and students are encouraged to attend Dr. Kropschot's address.

FAMED CHORAL GROUP TO PERFORM NOVEMBER 1

The nationally acclaimed Westminster Choir of Princeton, N. J. will perform in Wheelwright Auditorium at USC-Coastal Carolina College at 8 p.m. on Monday, November 1st, to open the college's 1982-83 Cultural Arts Series.

Season tickets for the four-event cultural arts program are on sale at the auditorium for \$15 for adults, \$10 for Coastal faculty and senior citizens, \$5 for students and \$3 for Coastal students. The season tickets will provide admission to the Westminster Choir performance and three other events. Tickets will also be sold at the door for \$5.00 for admission to the choir performance only.

The Westminster Choir is the major performing group of Westminster College in Princeton, N.J. The 40-voice choir has been synonymous with the best in choral tradition for almost 60 years. Since its founding in 1920, critics have singled out the choir for its virtuosity and consistently acclaimed singing.

Since 1972, the choir has been Chorus-in-Residence of the Spoleto, Italy arts celebration, "Festival of Two Worlds." The choir also performed at the inauguration of the Spoleto Festival U.S.A. in Charleston in 1977.

The choir has appeared with virtually all the major East Coast orchestras, including appearances in Philadelphia, Pittsburg, Washington, Atlanta, and the New York Philharmonic.

Season tickets are on sale at Wheelwright Auditorium, 8:30-5 p.m., Monday-Friday.
