BLOOD DRIVE SETS RECORD

The Alpha Omega blood drive at Coastal last week set a record with donations of 109 pints of blood. The blood drive, organized by the Alpha Phi Omega Service Fraternity in cooperation with the American Red Cross, was the most successful blood drive ever held at the college, according to Red Cross officials.

The 109 pints of blood will be credited to the blood needs of Angela Eaddy, a Coastal sophomore now undergoing chemotheraphy and whole blood replacement at Roper Hospital in Charleston.

SOUTHERN GRAPHICS SHOW AT COASTAL

An exhibit of 33 prints featuring experimental and mixed media processes as well as the more traditional intaglio, woodcut, lithographic and serigraphic methods will be shown at USC-Coastal Carolina College in the Kimbel Library and in the Student Center from 12-5 p.m., through Nov. 24. The show is open to the public.

The collection, sponsored by the Southern Graphics Council, is comprised entirely of prints by member artists. Included are works by artist-printmakers well known in the South.

The Southern Graphics Council is an organization of professional and student artists involed in some aspect of printmaking and/or drawing. Chartered in the state of South Carolina in 1973 as the Southeastern Graphics Council, the charter was amended in 1978 to include Southwestern state as well.

TEENS CAN LEARN TO OPERATE COMPUTERS THROUGH CLASS

Teenagers who are looking for a hobby with a practical application for the future are signing up for a noncredit short course in computer programming at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

The class, entitled "Learning to Talk to the Computer," begins Nov. 20 and meets weekly on Saturday mornings through December 18th. Classes will be held at Coastal Carolina College, in room 114 of the Singleton Building. and registration is now underway.

College officials say the popular class is limited and registration is accepted only on a first-come, first-serve basis.

"Particaipants in this course will have fun learning to make the computer perform various functions," says Dr. Sally Z. Hare., director of the Office of Continuing Education at the College.

"They'll learn to become familiar with the computer," she says. "They'll learn how to do arithmetic with a computer, how to get information in and out of the computer - how to do loops and counting, decisions and random numbers and how to program a simple computer game.

"Someday soon most homes will be equipped with a computer. This is an ideal way to encourage a young person to develop a hobby which will have practical and maybe professional applications in the future."

Hare says the suggested minimum age for the class is 12. Information is available from the Office of Continuing Education. Tuition is \$30 for five sessions.
