USC-COASTAL OFFERS ADULT INCENTIVE SCHOLARSHIPS

Adults who wish to return to college or who wish to enter college for the first time can now receive some special help from USC-Coastal Carolina College in the form of an Adult Incentive Scholarship.

The newly created scholarship, which is available only to people over age 21, will fund part of the cost of tuition at Coastal Carolina College. The scholarship is designed to encourage adults to attend college.

"Many adults are looking at career changes or they just want to further their education," says Dr. Sally Z. Hare, who is chairing the Adult Incentive Scholarship Committee. "The college is pleased to be able to offer the incentive scholarships as part of the school's community outreach program," say Dr. Hare.

"Coastal has always placed value on the adult learner, who has a unique place in the college community. We're pleased to be able to offer the Adult Incentive Scholarship as a way of encouraging adults to continue their education."

The scholarship is not based on income or financial statements. The main criteria are motivation, commitment to completing a degree and sound educational and career goals. Applicants must be at least 21 years old. They must be new students or students who have not attended the college for a least a year. They must have applied for admission or re-admission to the college and they cannot be receiving other financial aid.

The application deadline is December 1, 1982. Applications are available from the Office of Continuing Education at USC-Coastal Carolina College.

PERFORMANCE SYSTEM FOR EMPLOYEES TO BE IMPLEMENTED

State Personnel Division, with the aid of a consulting firm, has developed a revised performance appraisal system for all classified State employees. The new Employee Performance Management System is intended to increase efficiency and employee/employer communication through the use of planned performance objectives, written job duties and performance characteristics.

During a planning stage, at the beginning of the review period, the employee and supervisor define expected achievements to be made throughout the review period. At the end of the review period, the employee is rated at one of three levels of performance; exceeds performance requirements, meets performance requirements or below performance requirements. Performance is evaluated in three different areas: objectives, job duties and performance characteristics. This system encourages the employee and the supervisor to work to meet mutually set goals and performance requirements.

The procedure for handling substandard performance is modified under the Employee Performance Management System to allow the employee time to improve, but if no improvement is noted within the specified time the employee will be removed from the position by dismissal, transfer or demotion. This change is necessary due to the elimination of the marginal performance rating.

Full implementation of the program by the University must be completed by July 1, 1983. All supervisors will be mailed performance appraisal forms for their employees during January. The initial planning stage must be completed for all employees by March 1983.

Training in the administration of the new Employee Performance Management System is mandated by State Budget and Control Board. A schedule of training for supervisors in your area is attached. Please notify supervisors in of the date and time of the session they are to attend. In addition to the supervisory training, a brief orientation is planned for each employee during early January. Information concerning this orientaion will be sent at a later date. If a supervisor is unable to attend his/her scheduled session, please contact Mina Skinner in the Personnel Training Office, 7-6578, to arrange a more suitable time.

All supervisors of classified employees are scheduled to attend a training session on the new Employee Performance Management System on Tuesday, December 7, from 1:00 - 4:00 p.m. at Coastal Carloina College.
